On the crisp morning of 10th December 2024, the halls of Chitkara University, Punjab, stirred with quiet, resolute energy. In observance of Human Rights Day, the spirit of service took form, not in grand declarations, nor in fleeting gestures, but in the simplest, most profound offering of all: the gift of life. Under the aegis of Veins 2 Village, the National Service Scheme, in collaboration with Rajindra Hospital, Patiala, and Chitkara Business School, orchestrated a blood donation camp; a gathering not of spectators, but of willing hands, steady hearts, and souls bound by a singular purpose.

Within those walls, beneath the hum of determination, the act of giving transcended mere biology. It was not just the movement of lifeblood from one to another; it was the silent pledge of humanity to itself. Students, faculty, and staff stood shoulder to shoulder, each one a bearer of quiet courage, each one extending a part of themselves into the unknown. Some hands trembled with the weight of their first donation, some wore the ease of familiarity, but all shared the same unspoken understanding: to serve is to truly live.





One hundred and fifty units of blood left the veins of the willing and entered the flow of existence beyond. Somewhere, an unseen life will endure a little longer, a heart will beat a little steadier, a mother will hold her child a little closer. And though the givers may never meet the receivers, an invisible thread of kindness now binds them in ways deeper than words. For service is the echo of a soul that knows its worth. And in that space where life is gifted freely, man does not simply survive, he thrives.

- Strengthened bonds among participants through shared service.

On the 18th of February 2025, a resolute yet profound gathering took place at Chitkara University, Punjab. The National Service Scheme, through the powerful Veins2Village initiative, brought together the university's diverse community for a single, purposeful cause, a blood donation camp that was more than a mere event. It was a manifestation of the collective human spirit, where every drop shared became an emblem of compassion and unity.

The day was marked by collaboration, as the **Department of Computer Science Engineering** and **Rajindra Hospital**, **Patiala** joined forces to organize this event. As the day unfolded, the ripple of this effort spread, encompassing various departments, including **Mechanical Engineering**, **Electronics and Communication Engineering**, **and Computer Applications**. From every corner of the university, **1500 students emerged**, registering to participate in an initiative far beyond themselves. The presence of **Hon'ble Dr. Madhu Chitkara**, **Pro-Chancellor of Chitkara University**, was the heartbeat of this gathering. "We make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give."

These words found quiet resonance on **3rd April 2025** at **Chitkara University**, **Punjab**, where the atmosphere brimmed with a sense of purpose. The **National Service Scheme**, **Chitkara University School of Maritime Studies**, and **Neelam Hospital**, **Rajpura** came together to host a blood donation camp, an event rooted in compassion and quiet resolve.

Students from the maritime school stepped in with crisp white uniforms, the kind that speaks of clarity, discipline, and hands ready to serve. The room carried a stillness, not of silence, but of intention. One by one, students offered their time and their blood, fifty units in all. Each pouch marked a lifeline extended, a future kept intact, a story still unfolding somewhere else.

Their training prepares them for the unpredictable sea, for navigation across vast and wild horizons. But on this day, their direction pointed inward, to empathy, to steady giving, to the kind of strength that's calm and unshaken. They didn't need waves beneath their feet to create impact. They stood grounded and still managed to stir something deeply human.

The act didn't carry fanfare. No cameras flashing, no grand declarations. Just a stretch of hours shaped by generosity. A student sits, a needle pierces the skin, and with it flows more than blood; hope, trust, and the willingness to share what one has for






someone unknown. There's a tenderness in that choice, a maturity that doesn't chase recognition.

By sunset, the camp wound down, but the meaning lingered. A quiet legacy had been set in motion, fifty acts of kindness, steady as anchors. The sea may call them soon, with its tides and tempests, but this day will remain etched differently. A day where courage wore no medals and giving looked simple, sincere, and deeply enough.

Outcomes:

On 25 April 2025, under the organization of the National Service Scheme, a Blood Donation Camp was held at Chitkara University, Punjab, in association with Rajindra Hospital, Patiala. The initiative was supported by the collective efforts of the Chitkara College of Pharmacy, Chitkara School of Planning and Architecture (Interior Design), and Chitkara School of Mass Communication.

The day began with preparation. Registration desks, medical stations, and volunteer lines were arranged with precision. As morning settled into its rhythm, the space filled with steady movement, students arrived, faculty stepped forward, and support staff joined in without hesitation.

Each donor moved through the process with calm focus. The atmosphere remained organized and attentive throughout. From form filling to medical screening and the final donation, every stage was handled with care. Medical personnel from Rajindra Hospital managed procedures with professional consistency, while student volunteers ensured smooth coordination on ground.

There were no speeches, no elaborate gestures. Instead, the act of giving stood on its own, direct, composed, and dignified. Donors came with intention and left with a





sense of quiet fulfillment. The event did not require excess language; the presence of people was statement enough.

In its structure and spirit, the camp reflected the values that underlie public health initiatives: voluntary action, ethical commitment, and mutual support. The contribution of each individual added to a shared effort that reached beyond campus walls.

Beyond its immediate outcome, the camp acted as a live learning space. It called on academic departments to collaborate across roles, encouraged volunteers to hold responsibility, and allowed each participant to engage with service beyond theory. It made room for a different kind of education: one shaped by action, timing, and trust.

Events like this reflect the character of Chitkara University. The institution continues to build an environment where civic responsibility is not treated as an addition to academics, but as part of its rhythm. Here, compassion is not occasional, it is practiced, organized, and sustained.

Outcomes:

- 1. A successful multi-departmental blood donation camp was held on campus.
- 2. Active participation from students, faculty, and volunteers throughout the day.
- 3. Fostered a spirit of compassion, responsibility, and quiet collective service
