




ENTREPRENEURSHIP



The labor force on campus is from far away states of the country and comes from less privileged circumstances. To keep them comfortable as they perform their roles, Chitkara



clothes, toys, bags etc., The **Residential Services team** then hands over these material to the NSS volunteers for sharing with the lesser privileged children at our adopted villages through the NSS team.



NSS CARES FOR ADOPTED VILLAGES



Chitkara University has always led the way in giving

to society, based on their needs. **NSS (National Service Scheme),** a unit on our campus, with a thousand and three hundred volunteers, which works in collaboration with the Government, plays a key role in the efforts towards caring for the five villages adopted by Chitkara University for more than 2 decades now. Be it washroom, LEDs, water coolers, PCs, furniture, winter clothing or toys, **NSS** volunteers have always been at the forefront to take care of the villagers, living up to the slogan "*Not Me But You*".

2. **Green Plate Initiative**: Chitkara University implemented an efficient way to handle leftover food. Despite all efforts to cook meals as per the strength of the students who would be present and would have meals, leftover food arises owing to some students skipping meals and some eating lesser than norma or any such reason. Chitkara University planned a program to distribute the leftover food to the labour on campus. They are economically backward. Leftover cooked food is distributed to labourers as part of the university's CSR initiative. These efforts reduce environmental impact while promoting sustainability in food resource management.

3. Awareness on Organic Farming: One of the drives, was organised at Yellow Point Farms, for our students our Sustainable Farm where we have more than a dozen sustainable ventures including organic farming, Miyawaki forest, mushroom production etc. where students participated in planting fruit species along with vegetables. The drive fostered organic farming practices and aligned with multiple SDGs including SDG 2, contributing to sustainable agricultural practices.

Other such drives included a demonstration on turmeric vertical farming at Kurukshetra. Vertical farming, which maximizes land use efficiency, was shown to produce higher crop yields, a training program on organic vegetable production in collaboration with Mi Lifestyle Pvt Ltd, promoting the use of NOP & NPOP- certified agricultural product, a consultancy to GRM Overseas Ltd., for setting up an Agri Research Centre in Panipat where field trials were conducted on new rice varieties, contributing to the promotion of food security and national health.

FOOD DISTRIBUTION

As a practice, the hostel mess provides food that is not consumed by the residents, for the hungry labor. For years now, though students are encouraged to not waste any food, there would always be a certain percentage of hostelers who not turn up for dinner for do logical/illogical reasons. Such food is distributed to the labor that stays within the campus. In this year the various messes of the hostels have contributed food to more than 1745 families of labor. This food is not "wasted" but offered to the labor families turn wise. We proudly name this initiative the "Green Plate Initiative"!!

Chitkara School of Hospitality, in collaboration with the *Office of Infrastructure*, celebrates national celebrations like Independence Day,



Republic Day or celebrations like Diwali, Holi etc., with the labor force that resides within campus, by offering very sumptuous and healthy meals with them. Truly a way to celebrate the days, making sure no one stays hungry on special days, an aim to *"leaving no one behind"*!



ORGANIC CULTIVATION

Land exclusively dedicated to growing organic fruits & vegetables, yes, that's at our *Yellow Point Farm* - a living lab for green ventures. In total, about 15 different varieties of fruit species have been planted which include Aonla, Pomegranate, Red Apple Ber, Jamun, Mango, Litchi, Phalsa, Chikoo & Guava, etc. combat the problem of malnutrition and attain food security. For full utilization of land about 25 different vegetables were also planted as an intercrop. These vegetables included

a cocktail of exotic &



traditional vegetables.

Further initiatives include the Sustainable Mushroom Production unit at the Yellow Point Farms. At our unit we are procuring spawn run mushrooms from a reputed Horticulture University of Haryana. This ensures us the authenticity of the spawn or mushroom seed which would ensure quality produce too. Chitkara University has been providing intricacies on rice crop production technology at their Agri Research Centre at GRM Overseas which is one of the largest basmati rice processors & exporters in India.

Various field trials on new rice varieties are being laid down, contributing to social welfare and overall national health.

We offer agriculture consultancy services pan India, at an unparalleled rate, without burning a hole in the client's pocket. Through such consultancy we have been providing

services to several progressive farmers as well as private companies, helping them with agribusiness, food processing infrastructure, and retail distribution projects worldwide across the agriculture sector. With more than *forty-three awareness programs and many health checkup camps*

on campus as well as in the Society for children, women and the old, efforts are made to provide regular support for healthcare. Students play a major role in all these activities. As part of their activities, they offer medical support and awareness

sessions to the villagers as well as the taskforce on campus. These include eye-checkup camps, general health check-up camps, and much more. Students visited old age homes as well as half-way homes to provide health check facilities. Our alliances with renowned institutions and healthcare organizations across the globe provide unparalleled opportunities for student and faculty exchanges. Through these programs, students gain international exposure and experience diverse healthcare systems, which helps broaden their perspectives and skills. Faculty exchange programs allow educators to share knowledge, teaching practices, and clinical expertise, fostering academic innovation.





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The Creche at the campus is also a facility extended to the staff and students on campus where their young toddlers can be taken care of as they concentrate on their studies and work. The toddlers of the creche are also provided with regular health check-up by the students of healthcare.

NURTURING THE PASSION OF STUDENTS

The Office of Student Affairs (OSA) at Chitkara University, Punjab, is dedicated to enhancing the student experience by providing a platform for holistic development and personal growth.

Central to this mission is the Chitkara Cultural and Social Society (C2S2), which comprises various vibrant clubs that cater to the diverse interests of our students.

Whether it's exploring artistic talents with Club Reflection, capturing moments through Club Tasveer, or preserving cultural traditions with The Bhangra Regiment and The Lethal Giddha Squad, students find numerous ways to express themselves. By participating in these clubs, students follow their passions alongside their academic pursuits, promoting creativity, teamwork, and leadership skills. The OSA, through these clubs, has positively impacted over 4,500 students, contributing significantly to their overall growth, happiness, and holistic development.

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1250+ INDIVIDUAL SESSIONS

Annually, approximately 250 individual counseling sessions are conducted, addressing issues such as anxiety, depression, and academic challenges. Each case includes 4-5 follow-up sessions, totaling around 1,250 sessions peryear. Special attention is given to sensitive profiles, with dedicated follow-ups and separate indexing for comprehensive support.

AWARENESS PROGRAMS

Awareness programs on mental well-being were conducted for 5,500 freshman students across all departments. Additionally, collaboration with faculty and staff led to the development of mental health resources and workshops, targeting both faculty and students.

COUNSELLING CELL ON CAMPUS

19+ GROUP SESSIONS

19 plus group sessions were conducted, reaching approximately 2,500 students on topics like stress management, mindfulness, -emotional regulation, self-awareness, resilience, and frustration tolerance. Interactive and inclusive approaches were implemented to foster a supportive community and enhance mental well- being.

FACULTY & STAFF SESSIONS

Seven faculty sessions and four warden sessions were organized to upskill 85 attendees in supporting students effectively. Additionally, awareness events and campaigns were conducted to reduce stigma and encourage help-seeking behavior.

Chitkara University contributes to the emotional and mental health support of its students and faculty. We understand the challenges that come with academic pressures and personal growth. To support this, free counselling services are available to all students and faculty members. This cell provides a safe, confidential space to address personal issues, stress, anxiety, academic pressures, and other mental health concerns.

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
The Noble Act of Blood Donation





1. SDG 4 (Quality Education): -The most significant focus in Chitkara University's curriculum lies in SDG 4, with the largest number of subjects dedicated to ensuring inclusive and equitable quality education. This reflects the university's dedication to providing access to quality education for all, fostering a generation of students who are well-prepared to solve complex global problems. Emphasis on education further strengthens the role of teachers, researchers, and educational professionals in shaping a sustainable future.

2. SDG 9: Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure: - Another substantial portion of the syllabus is aligned with SDG 9, which underscores the importance of building resilient infrastructure, promoting inclusive industrialization, and fostering innovation. • SDG 7: Affordable and Clean Energy – Subjects related to renewable energy technologies, sustainability in energy consumption, and innovation in the energy sector.


• SDG 13: Climate Action – Educating students on climate change mitigation, adaptation strategies, and the importance of environmental stewardship.

The 2023-24 period has seen several patents filed across diverse industries, from healthcare to environmental technology.

Notable Patents Filed:

1. **Multi-Purpose Walker with Foldable Seats and Dual Braking System**: - This innovative device offers a versatile solution for elderly and disabled individuals, providing both mobility and seating options. It addresses SDG 3 (Good Health and Wellbeing) by improving the quality of life for the elderly and disabled, and SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure) by contributing to innovative healthcare technologies.

2. Water Cooler to Prevent Wastage of Water: - Aimed at addressing water conservation, this patent focuses on an innovative cooling system that prevents unnecessary water wastage, contributing to SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation) and SDG 13 (Climate Action). Such patents exemplify the university's commitment to sustainability and environmental responsibility.

3. Socket Slider: - This patent introduces a sliding mechanism to improve the safety and functionality of electrical sockets, addressing SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure) and SDG 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities) by enhancing infrastructure safety and energy efficiency in homes and businesses.

4. **Portable Mobile Holder Clamp on Adapter:** - An innovative solution for mobile users, this portable clamp addresses user comfort and device safety. It further contributes to SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure) by promoting accessibility and usability of technology in daily life.






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RESEARCH




SILAI CENTRE

A vocational venture for the women, by women, sponsored by Chitkara University!!

A vocational training center for the women of the village, SILAI CENTRE, is a *Vocational Centre*, fully managed by the *NSS Unit of Chitkara University*, where girls from *Thuha* Village, one of the five adopted villages of the university, are trained on skills of stitching. The syllabus and the course work are designed by Chitkara University, the material for the classes

and the resource person are all provided by Chitkara University. The girls who enroll themselves can acquire the required skills of stitching, at *absolutely no cost*. This helps girls to attain skills at no cost and become confident and employable, thus becoming financially independent and taking a strong stand to support their families. Yes. when 220 girls learn at the Centre, they gain a skill, at absolutely no cost, and this positively helps 220 families, and *hence on an average 880 lives....that is the impact* !! Further, the university provides them the work opportunity of creating gifts of "phulkari", a traditional art work of the colorful state of Punjab, which the university proudly presents to its guests. This provides the girls with employment opportunities and the university with quality gifts. An opportunity where the girls become independent, grow economically, can help their families out of poverty and hence keep hunger at bay. It's a total win-win situation catering to SDGs 5, 8, 1 and 2!!!







"Equal rights, equal might – women's equality fuels society's flight." Various sports events as well as awareness sessions and sensitisation sessions are held on campus to spread the need to inculcate a feeling of equality for women.

<u>SPORTS</u> - The Mechstein Club of the Department of Mechanical Engineering, in collaboration with the Chitkara University Sports Board, organized a dynamic basketball event, at the Chitkara University Punjab Basketball Court. The event was conducted under the themes of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 3, 5, and 10,

The women are made aware of all the avenues through which they can approach the authorities for help, in case any situation arises. *Womens' day Celebrations* on campus is done every year to not only emphasize on the important role she plays but to also encourage the male counterparts to appreciate the role. This year the event focused on empowering women by highlighting their experiences, challenges, and achievements in the workplace, while also providing education on optimal oral hygiene. 

EFFORTS FOR PRUDENT UTILISATION OF WATER

Water provided on campus is absolutely free, tested for quality, and available 24*7*365; but we spread awareness that this resource is scarce and hence must be used prudently. Notices are displayed at all water stations and washrooms to remind users not to waste water. Complaints of water leakage are given emergency status by the Maintenance Department to arrest every possibility of water leakage.





The treated water is used for horticulture as well as for double plumbing in various

buildings. This helps reduce the usage of freshwater and this treated water further gets treated in the STPs as it is



used.

<u>**RECYCLING WATER – TREATMENTS PLANTS – The University treats used</u></u> water in its Sewage Treatment Plant based on the MBBR technology to treat the wastewater. 90% of the water used is treated and reused so that we can reduce consumption of freshwater.</u>** Page **36** of **88**



USAGE OF TREATED WATER: More than 90% of the water used on campus in treated in the various STPs of the campus. Water used for horticulture is mostly treated water, thus reducing the usage of freshwater for plantation.



ADDITIONALRAINWATERHARVESTING PITS

Chitkara University, Punjab takes Rainwater conservation as its basic Social Responsibility. While the university has 16 RWH pits,



open grass pavers are also installed in the university to enable the rainwater to seep through the soil. Chitkara University separate Recharging pits for the Separate Roof top catchment areas of the building (Hostels,

auditorium, Academic blocks) to recharge more run off. In this year we added 3 Rainwater recharging pits, and more recharging pits are proposed in the next years.



MORE DRIP IRRIGATION In this year we have added 25 more drip irrigation points in our gardens and 5 more sprinklers. All these have been done as an effort to reduce water usage and ensure effective usage of water.

TAPPING WATER FROM AC OUTLETS- In this year we have tapped water from 80 Air conditioners to avoid any wastage

of water from AC outlets. The water so tapped is used for irrigation. Other measures adopted in the year include additional low flow faucets and censor based plumbing fixtures in the newly constructed green building.





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There have been about a dozen activities to encourage students to understand the need to save water. There were



competitions and other activities like poster making, elocutions and debates on the need for water saving. Further, there were street plays also organised to spread the message. On the link provided below is one of the patents by our faculty for clean water

850 KwP, we initiated process to add another 150 KwP to our Solar Power Plant, adding to our sustainability practices on clean and renewable energy. Solar panels were provided for one of the adopted villages also.







SUSTAINABLE COMMUTING



Chitkara University is deeply committed to promoting sustainability in every aspect of campus life, and one of the key pillars of this commitment is sustainable commuting. As part of our broader environmental goals, we have implemented a range of initiatives that encourage eco-friendly transportation, reduce carbon emissions, and contribute to a cleaner, healthier campus. This year *more than 800 faculty were provided with free public transportation service*, thus reducing the carbon emission of 800 vehicles and providing them a stress-free commute to office and back.

As part of our push

for green mobility, Chitkara University has introduced *Electric Golf Carts and EV Mini Tempos* as eco-friendly transportation options within the campus. These electric vehicles provide an efficient and zero-emission way for students, staff, and visitors to move around the campus, particularly when traveling between buildings or facilities that are far apart.

Carpooling is another key element of Chitkara University's sustainable commuting program. To promote the concept of sharing rides, the university encourages both students and staff to participate in carpooling initiatives, which help reduce the number of vehicles on the road, ease traffic congestion,

and cut down on pollution. The campus community has embraced this concept, forming informal carpool networks that not only make commuting more cost-effective but also foster social interaction and a sense of shared responsibility for the environment.

SOLAR LOUNGES

The university grounds are home to several innovative features, including the Solar Lounge a testament to Chitkara's forward-thinking approach to energy use. This eco-friendly initiative provides students with a space to unwind while actively promoting the use of renewable energy. Scattered around the campus are several small, comfortable solar lounges designed with sustainability and student well-being in mind, created by repurposing old tables. These lounges are equipped with eco-friendly furniture, solar-powered amenities, and rainwater harvesting systems. These smaller green spaces provide students with opportunities to engage with nature daily, promoting both ecological awareness and physical well-being.

RETROFITTED E-BIKE

A group of students from the DICE at Chitkara University, Rajpura, Punjab, successfully completed the Retrofitted E-Bike project under the guidance of Dr. Rajneesh Talwar. Funded by a grant from NewGen IEDC. The conversion process involved removing the petrol engine, installing an electric motor, battery, and controller, and introducing modern functionalities. The modified bike, which boasts a top speed of 75 km/h, a range of 120 km on a single charge, reverse gear, 3-speed mode, and remote ignition, highlights the potential of electric bikes as sustainable transportation and is now ready for use at Chitkara University. E-CYCLE

The "E-Cycle" project focuses on creating a cost-effective, lightweight, and user-friendly electric bicycle powered by a BLDC motor and lithium battery. Key features include quick charging, GPS tracking, and the ability to pedal manually if the battery runs out. The electric bike provides an extended range, ease of use on uneven terrain, and requires no license or taxes. This eco-friendly transportation solution supports sustainable practices and offers a practical, modern alternative for daily commuting.

Another feather in our cap is the efforts of the students to create projects with scrap material from the junk yard, and provide facilities for the physically challenged, with a battery-operated tricycle.



WHEEL CHAIR CUM SOLAR E-TRICYCLE

The "Wheelchair Cum Solar E-Tricycle," developed by the Department of Interdisciplinary Courses in Engineering (DICE) at Chitkara University, addresses the mobility challenges faced by individuals with disabilities. This innovative project repurposes scrap materials and harnesses solar power, offering a sustainable and ecofriendly alternative for wheelchair mobility. The solarpowered roof not only provides an environmentally friendly power source but also serves as a protective shelter for the rider. By reducing waste and utilizing renewable energy, the tricycle exemplifies the potential of sustainable transportation solutions for everyday use, aiming to enhance the independence and quality of life for people with disabilities.

CHITKARA LEADERSHIP SUMMIT 2024





NATIONAL CHUNG CHENG UNIVERSITY, TAIWAN:



also celebrated on campus.





GREEN SPACES



WASTE MANAGEMENT

There has been a tremendous number of efforts steered towards proper management of waste. Policies are in place and so are



processes. This year the efforts were towards reducing the waste to landfill. With continuous efforts in this year, we managed to repurpose and reuse /recycle 87% of our waste and only 13% was sent to the landfill, and that too as per the laid norms of the Government.

BOTTLES BIN



Single use plastic is banned on campus since 2022. But for the rest of the plastic that finds its way into the campus as bottles for soft drinks etc. Many a time these would get into the general waste and there were chances of these finding

their way to the landfill. To avoid the same and to encourage students to deposit their bottles at a place from where they could easily be repurposed/ reused, we created a *Bottles Bin*, which is very well used by all students now. This way we ensure best disposal of plastic bottles.





FOOD WASTE At Chitkara University, efforts to manage food waste on campus are part of a broader commitment to sustainability. The food waste generated in the campus dining facilities is effectively utilized through multiple eco-friendly initiatives. A significant portion is sent to a piggery, where it serves as animal feed, reducing waste while supporting local agriculture. Another portion is used in biogas production, where organic waste is converted into renewable energy, contributing to a greener campus.

Additionally, food waste is processed through vermicomposting, enriching the soil with natural compost that supports campus landscaping and gardening. Any remaining waste is responsibly disposed of in a landfill pit, ensuring minimal environmental impact. These integrated waste management practices reflect the university's dedication to sustainability and its proactive approach to reducing food waste.

<u>PAPER RECYCLING PLANT -</u> The plant processes wastepaper collected from across the campus, transforming it into recycled paper products. This initiative not only reduces the environmental impact by minimizing paper waste but also educates students and staff about the importance of circular economy practices. The plant serves as a live laboratory for students, providing hands-on experience in waste management, sustainability practices, and green

innovations. It is integrated into the curriculum, offering learning opportunities through projects and research on ecofriendly paper production techniques.

STUBBLE USED FOR MUSHROOM PRODUCTION UNIT The Mushroom Production Unit at the Rajpura Campus works on preserving food through sustainable methods. The existing Mushroom Production Unit was renovated using stubble from nearby farms, thus reducing the amount of stubble that farmers tend to burn, causing pollution to the environment. Further, by making use of natural resources like water and sunlight, the unit strives to minimize food waste and support sustainable farming practices. This effort is in line with a focus on responsible consumption and production.











SUSTAINABLE LIFESTYLE WORKSHOP AND HANDS-ON BIO ENZYME WORKSHOP

The Department of Communication Design, in collaboration with the Centre of Excellence for Sustainability and College of Education, hosted a special event on 22nd April 2024 to celebrate World Earth Day. During this event, attendees will learn about the importance of reducing waste, recycling, and using eco-friendly products. The event featured two insightful workshops: a Sustainable Lifestyle Workshop and a Hands-on Bio Enzyme Workshop. The primary objective of the Earth Day Event was to raise awareness about environmental issues and the importance of sustainable living practices among participants.

STARTUPS CONTRIBUTING TO SDG12

CUSTOSHOES - A circular economy startup, they specialize in converting *old shoes into new and trendy shoes* by repairing them and providing eye catching trends. They leverage AI/ML technology and 3D scanners to provide new designs and provide customers with more choices and provide customization of shoes and create matching *Lehangas* as well.

They go a step further and contribute towards the society as they *train the local artisans from villages* and get the repair and beautification work done by these artists providing them 30% of profits for their work



PARRAVE VENTURES PVT. LTD. - An IOT-based smart vending machine startup. The startup uses *recycled materials* sourced from sustainable suppliers in the machines they create and also use *energy-efficient components* of the highest quality along with Sensors and LED lights to save on energy.

At Parrave, *a tree is planted* for every deployed machine to offset our carbon footprint. It's a startup that understands and contributes towards EPR!!



CHITKARA UNIVERSITY'S LOW CARBON ENERGY TRACKING

The institution's initiatives to monitor and reduce carbon emissions through solar energy utilization. The university leverages two advanced solar cloud-based monitoring systems—iSolarCloud by Sungrow and Aurora Vision by Fimer. These systems are used to track the performance of solar power plants with capacities of 200 KWp and 350 KWp, respectively.





The university aims to achieve carbon neutrality by 2029, focusing on areas such as renewable energy expansion, enhancing energy efficiency, promoting electric vehicle use, improving waste management, and increasing green cover on campus. Overall, the total emissions for 2023-24 were 1,383.60 tons of CO₂ equivalent, showing a reduction from the previous year's total of 1,821.29 tons.

In addition to solar energy, Chitkara University has embraced energy-efficient technologies such as LED lighting and energy-saving HVAC systems. By replacing traditional lighting with LEDs, the university has reduced energy consumption for lighting by up to 75%.



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WORLD NATURE CONSERVATION DAY

The Department of Computer Applications, under the aegis of the National Service Scheme (NSS), organized the Poster Making Competition in online mode to celebrate World Nature Conservation Day. The posters featured powerful messages and striking visuals, highlighting the need for sustainable practices, biodiversity preservation, and the protection of wildlife. The event provided a platform for students to channel their artistic talents towards a noble cause. The competition fostered a sense of responsibility and commitment among participants, inspiring them to play an active role in environmental preservation.



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MIYAWAKI FOREST AT CHITKARA UNIVERSITY: University has initiated a Miyawaki Forest project to enhance biodiversity and contribute to a greener campus environment. This forest, located at Yellow Point Farms within the university, spans an area of 300 square meters and includes 1,200 native plants. The Miyawaki method, known for its quick forestation process, uses local tree species to replicate natural forest ecosystems, resulting in rapid growth and increased biodiversity.





MUSHROOM PRODUCTION UNIT: In September 2023, Yellow Point Farms at Chitkara University launched a flagship Mushroom Production Unit, aligning with India's focus on boosting vegetable and fruit production. The Sustainable Mushroom Production Unit at Yellow Point Farms is constructed using eco-friendly materials like paddy straw and scrap wood, making it a cost-effective alternative to modern setups.

VERTICAL GARDENS AND TERRACE GARDENS: Every

inch of space matters; hence to increase greenery on campus we have many vertical gardens and terrace gardens too. These add to the greenery and to the aesthetic look of the venue. The terrace gardens are spaces where students and faculty enjoy the greenery as they engross on some leisure time. 




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COLLABORATIONS
