

Partners in Learning: Empowering through Peer Teaching

The Department of Education (DoE) hosted an informative session titled "Partners in Learning: Empowering through Peer Teaching" for Alpha Teachers from Semester 1 (2024 – 26 batch) on 3rd October 2024, as part of Module Delivery. The academic team from the Department of Education at Chitkara University led the session focusing on key principles and best practices of peer teaching. The session aimed to demonstrate effective communication and interpersonal skills while enhancing the learning outcome yet further. Alpha Teachers prepared and delivered lessons taken from CBSE text book prescribed for classes 6 th to 10th. The lessons were prepared from their main teaching subject for which they were divided into groups.








Four-day specialized training for B.Ed. and M.Sc. Clinical Psychology students The University Readiness Academy (URA)

The University Readiness Academy (URA) recently conducted a four-day specialized training for B.Ed. Teachers and MSc Clinical Psychology students, preparing them for placements with the prestigious GEMS Educational Group in the UAE. The training focused on helping students excel in GEMS' rigorous global recruitment process, especially the international interview marking rubrics. Souray Roy, Director of URA, shared insights into past GEMS interview questions & marking rubrics. A key part of the training was gaming the GEMS' 100-mark interview rubric, used by 300 schools globally by GEMS, which URA revealed to Chitkara students. URA spent three weeks using data scraping tools like Octoparse and Diffbot to uncover GEMS' most commonly asked questions and the rubrics recruiters use to evaluate teachers. This analysis greatly boosted students' confidence by giving them clarity on crucial areas like classroom management, adaptability, and communication. The training concluded with techniques for making impactful first impressions. Students learned the Hook Word Methodology, KISS principle, and HTF techniques, aligned with the previously revealed GEMS recruiter rubrics by URA, enabling them to deliver memorable 30second introductions and approach their interviews with confidence.








Diwali Celebrations 2024








Mentor Magnificence: Guru Dakshta





Guru-Dakshta NEP: 15.8, SDG 4 19th October 2024





Interpretation:



Section wise Compliance of New Education Policy (NEP) 2020



Interpretation:

NEP 2020 aims at transforming the Indian education system to meet the needs of 21st Century. It seeks to adopt a multi-disciplinary approach in the higher education system. In order to achieve the recommendations, put forward by NEP 2020, various activities were conducted in the months of October-December 2024. Department of Education was able to provide exposure to Alpha Teachers in 24 areas of NEP 2020. The above graph depicts the representation of the percentage-wise attainment levels of the various suggestions put forward by NEP 2020.

From this graph, it can be concluded that

- 1. DOE was able to achieve 12% of the NEP-2020 recommendations in one area viz. NEP 12.7 focuses on Internationalization fostered to attain this goal of global quality standards, attract greater numbers of international students, and achieve the goal of 'internationalization at home'.
- 2. 9% of the recommendations were achieved in one area viz. NEP 5.6. approaches towards Schools/school complexes will be encouraged to hire local eminent persons or experts as 'master instructors' in various subjects, such as in traditional local arts, vocational crafts, entrepreneurship, agriculture, or any other subject where local expertise exists, to benefit students and help preserve and promote local knowledge and professions.
- 3.6% of the recommendations were achieved in one area viz. NEP 4.4, 11.1, 15.1 & 22.1. focuses on The aim of education will not only be cognitive development, but also building character and creating holistic and well-rounded



individuals equipped with the key 21st century skills. Ultimately, knowledge is a deep-seated treasure and education helps in its manifestation as the perfection which is already within an individual. All aspects of curriculum and pedagogy will be reoriented and revamped to attain these critical goals NEP 11.1 holistic and multidisciplinary learning, from universities.
