








FASHION SHOW

DESCRIPTION

The "WINGS OF LOGISTICS: INTRODUCTION TO AIR CARGO BY IATA" workshop, organized by SCM & General Management, Chitkara Business School, Chitkara University, Punjab, from March 3rd to March 7th, 2025, provided an in-depth exploration of air cargo operations under the guidance of Dr. Alok Tyagi, a certified IATA Trainer. This intensive five-day program aimed to equip students with foundational knowledge and practical insights into air cargo logistics, operations, and regulations, aligning with global industry standards. On Day 1, participants were introduced to the International Air Transport Association (IATA), its significance in regulating air cargo logistics, and its sustainability initiatives focused on reducing carbon footprints. They also explored global geographical trade routes crucial for air cargo movements. Day 2 delved into OAG (Official Airline Guide), providing insights into airline scheduling and air cargo planning. Participants also learned about IATA codes for airports, airlines, and cargo identification, along with cargo acceptance procedures, ensuring







compliance with safety and regulatory standards. Moving to Day 3, the workshop covered cargo agency operations, emphasizing the role of freight forwarders in international trade, followed by a discussion on the acceptance of cargo and the various handling facilities required for different types of shipments. Day 4 focused on aircraft and cargo handling, highlighting the different types of aircraft used for air cargo transport, their loading capacities, and the significance of Unit Load Devices (ULDs) in streamlining operations. Participants also learned about the procedures involved in loading, unloading, and securing cargo within aircraft. On the final day, Day 5, the workshop covered crucial air cargo documentation, including the Air Waybill (AWB), an essential legal and logistical document, and the Shipper's Letter of Instruction (SLI), which facilitates smooth cargo processing. Additionally, special cargo handling procedures were explored, covering perishable goods, dangerous goods, and live animal shipments. The session also addressed Cargo IQ standards and compliance codes, which help maintain efficiency and quality in cargo transportation. Throughout the workshop, Dr. Tyagi's expert insights and interactive teaching methodologies enhanced participants' understanding of air cargo operations, ensuring they acquired industry-relevant knowledge. The workshop concluded with an engaging Q&A session, followed by the distribution of certificates, acknowledging the participants' dedication and commitment to learning. By bridging academic concepts with practical industry applications, this workshop provided students with a strong foundation in air cargo logistics, preparing them for future careers in aviation management, logistics, and supply chain operations. The "WINGS OF LOGISTICS" workshop successfully reinforced Chitkara University's commitment to providing highquality, industry-oriented education, empowering students with the knowledge and skills needed to excel in the competitive global aviation and logistics sector.

DESCRIPTION

Chitkara Law School successfully organized its much-anticipated Intra-College Debate Competition, an intellectually stimulating event designed to nurture critical thinking, public speaking skills, and informed discourse among students. What set the competition apart was its inclusive nature, welcoming participants not only from the Law School but also from the Departments of Economics, Business, and Computer Science Engineering. This interdisciplinary participation underscored a shared passion for debating current legal and political issues in India. A total of ten teams, labeled Team A to Team J, competed in the event. The proceedings began with an inspiring inaugural address by Prof. (Dr.) Ajay Ranga, Dean of Chitkara Law School. Dr. Ranga motivated students to explore diverse viewpoints and emphasized debate as a tool to craft structured, rational arguments. His words energized the participants and established an intellectual ambiance for the event. The preliminary round







commenced with the drawing of chits to assign teams their position—either for or against the motion—and to determine their opponents. Each team was given a total of 10 minutes, split equally between two speakers, along with 4 minutes for rebuttals. This structure enabled teams to clearly articulate their arguments while showcasing their ability to respond quickly and effectively to opposing views. The panel of judges comprised three esteemed faculty members: Dr. Aksiptika Rattan and Dr. Jasdeep Kaur from the Law Department, and Dr. Anu Verma from the Education Department. The judges assessed the performances based on several criteria, including content, clarity, delivery, rebuttal quality, and overall persuasiveness. They also shared motivational insights with the students, highlighting debate as a crucial skill in developing leadership and communication capabilities. Throughout the preliminary rounds, the competition was dynamic and engaging. Students displayed passion and sharpness in argumentation, contributing to a charged atmosphere of intellectual rigor and mutual respect. After a short refreshment break, scores were tallied, and the two highestscoring teams advanced to the final round. In the final round, chits were again drawn to assign stances. Each team received 20 minutes—10 minutes per speaker—along with 6 minutes for rebuttals. The final debate was intense and thought-provoking, with both teams demonstrating articulate delivery, solid research, and remarkable composure. The judges faced a tough decision in choosing the winners. The event concluded with a prize distribution ceremony. Trophies and certificates were awarded to the winning and runner-up teams, and the Best Speaker title was conferred upon one outstanding participant. All participants received certificates of participation. The event achieved its goal of promoting analytical thinking, confidence, and respectful dialogue, and will remain a standout in Chitkara Law School's academic calendar.
