






# Posh Awareness Training The What, Why and How (6<sup>th</sup> July, 2024)

## **About the Activity**

A comprehensive eight-day ESG program was conducted at the Asian Institute of Technology (AIT) Extension in Thailand, bringing together a diverse group of thirty students from various academic disciplines. The program was meticulously designed to provide a holistic understanding of Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) principles and their critical role in shaping a sustainable future. Through a combination of expert-led sessions, interactive workshops, and real-world case studies, participants delved deep into the complexities of ESG implementation and reporting. The curriculum covered a wide range of topics, including environmental sustainability, ethical business practices, and the strategic use of emerging technologies such as AI and data analytics to drive ESG







initiatives. A highlight of the program was a site visit to Siam Kubota Co. Ltd., where students gained firsthand experience of sustainable practices in action, particularly in the realm of wastewater management. Additionally, the program incorporated a cultural immersion component, allowing participants to explore local markets and interact with the community, fostering a deeper appreciation for the social and economic dimensions of sustainability. This experiential learning approach complemented the academic curriculum, providing students with a well-rounded perspective on ESG challenges and opportunities. The program concluded with a certificate distribution ceremony, marking the successful completion of an intensive learning journey. Beyond academic knowledge, the event served as a platform for networking and collaboration, with discussions between Chitkara University and AIT leadership exploring potential joint initiatives in the field of sustainability.

#### Day wise report

On Day 1, 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2024, A cohort of thirty students from diverse academic backgrounds, including IPM, Liberal Arts, Engineering, Design, and Physiotherapy, convened at the Asian Institute of Technology (AIT) Extension in Thailand for an eight-day immersive program centered on Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) principles. The program aimed to cultivate a comprehensive understanding of ESG and its pivotal role in sustainability. The program commenced with a formal welcome from Mr. Voravate Chonlasin, Executive Director of AIT Extension, followed by a session on "ESG in Today's World" delivered by ESG expert Ms. Prae Piromya. Ms. Piromya shared her extensive experience in guiding organizations towards sustainable practices. To foster in-depth learning, participants engaged in case studies, group activities, and a sustainable pyramid exercise. These experiential learning opportunities allowed students to explore real-world ESG challenges, analyze stakeholder perspectives, and grasp the complexities of ESG implementation and reporting. At







the end of the day, students presented key takeaways from the session in a designated AIT group, which will serve as a valuable assessment component for program evaluation.

On Day 2, 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2024, On the second day of the Towards Sustainability program, students delved deeper into the intricate world of ESG. Dr. Gopi Krishna, Affiliate Faculty of the Masters in ESG program at AIT's School of Management, provided a comprehensive overview of environmental sustainability principles and concepts. Equipped with various tools and frameworks, students learned to assess sustainability in different contexts. The afternoon brought an exciting shift as students embarked on a field trip to True Digital Park. This hands-on experience provided invaluable insights into the realms of big data and IoT, underscoring the pivotal role of technology in advancing ESG initiatives. The visit also presented an opportunity for the accompanying faculty members to explore potential internship placements for students.

Day 3, 24<sup>th</sup> July 2024, On the third day of the summer program, students gained valuable knowledge from two distinguished experts. Dr. Sujata Bhatia, a professional development coach, introduced students to the concepts of Strategic and Design Thinking. Meanwhile, Mr. David Galipeau, a visiting faculty member from the AIT School of Management, delved into the critical areas of ESG standards, ethical operations, and sustainability. Mr. Galipeau provided insights into how organizations can balance ethical considerations with their sustainability objectives. To enhance the learning experience, the session incorporated interactive workshops facilitated by the experts. A productive meeting between Chitkara faculty members and AIT leadership explored opportunities for collaboration. Discussions with the Director of International Affairs, Chitkara faculty and Dr. Zakir from AIT Extension focused on potential joint initiatives, including sustainability-focused talks.

On Day 4, 25<sup>th</sup> July 2024, Day four of the program delved into the transformative potential of emerging technologies. Participants explored the applications of Generative AI, Remote







Sensing, and Drone Technology, as well as the critical role of ESG in shaping the Thai business landscape. Expert insights were shared by Dr. Zakir, Dr. Pallavi, Mr. Anish, and Mr. Kona. A site visit to Siam Kubota Co. Ltd provided firsthand experience of ESG implementation, with a particular focus on wastewater management and other sustainable practices.

Day 5, 26<sup>th</sup> July 2024, The session delved into the synergy between design thinking and sustainable development. Participants gained insights into the pivotal role of digital transformation in advancing ESG practices. Through a case study presented by Mr. Reynaldo Calabdan, the session underscored the importance of leadership in driving sustainability initiatives. The event concluded with a certificate distribution ceremony and mutual greetings, marking a successful knowledge-sharing experience.

Day 6, 27<sup>th</sup> July 2024, Students embarked on an immersive cultural and economic exploration of Pattaya. A bustling local market provided a sensory feast, introducing students to the vibrant market of Thai. The ferry journey offered a unique perspective of the region, while direct interactions with locals fostered a deeper understanding of everyday life and economic realities. This experiential learning opportunity equipped students with valuable insights into Thai culture, market dynamics, and the interconnectedness of local communities.







#### **Report on Seminar**

Chitkara College of Pharmacy, Chitkara University, Punjab conducted a National Seminar on Industry-Academia Collaboration for Water Security on August 31, 2024.

**Prof. Narinder Singh** has a PhD from GNDU and postdoctoral research at Osaka City University, Japan, followed by positions at Yonsei University, Korea, and Robert Gordon University, Scotland, UK. In 2009, he joined the Indian Institute of Technology Ropar (IIT Ropar) and is currently a Professor of Chemistry there. He served as the Department Chair from October 2011 to March 2015 and later as the Chair for the GATE Exam. Dr. Singh's research focuses on the synthesis of organic materials for chemosensors and engineering applications. He has completed numerous national and international projects. His prolific research output includes 335 papers published in international peer-reviewed journals, predominantly in the Royal Chemical Society and American Chemical Society publications. Additionally, he has mentored 18 PhD students, 5 postdoctoral fellows, and numerous MSc students.

Prof. Singh talked about the existing challenges of the 21st century from industrial, domestic, and agricultural waste which contribute to water pollution in abundance. He demonstrated advancements in nanoscale science and engineering that offer promising solutions to improve water quality. Innovations such as nanosorbents, nanocatalysts, bioactive nanoparticles, nanostructured catalytic membranes, and nanoparticle-enhanced filtration systems. He also elaborated the work of his research team in developing nanotechnology-derived products that have the potential to tackle various water contamination issues effectively. The nanomaterials act as high-capacity, recyclable ligands for toxic metal ions, radionuclides, and both organic and inorganic solutes and anions in aqueous solutions which provide a robust and sustainable approach to water purification. Prof. Singh also presented the role of nanomaterials in water purification and quality monitoring for both industrial and public water supplies which significantly mitigate the adverse impacts of water pollution and move towards a cleaner and safer aquatic system.

**Prof.(Dr) Manmohan Chhibber** is heading the Department of Chemistry and is also In charge of Sophisticated Analytical Instruments Laboratories in Thapar Institute of Engineering & Technology. He completed his PhD at Panjab University, Chandigarh, and Post Doc at IISc., Bangalore. Dr Chhibber has rich experience of the quality control unit of the Industry. He accomplished five projects sponsored by UGC, DST, DBT & BRNS. Under his guidance, 7 scholars completed their PhD. To further enhance the research collaboration, he visited Trinity College Dublin, Ireland, University of Queensland.







Prof. Chhibber deliberated about Water Security - its understanding, multifaceted challenges & mitigation. Because water security is a crucial aspect of sustainable development, that involves ensuring that all individuals have access to sufficient, safe, and affordable water for various needs, while also maintaining the resilience of water systems against natural and human-induced challenges so he talked about its multifaceted challenges that compromise not only its quantity and quality but also the socio-economic and environmental impact. Dr Chhibber also emphasized mitigation strategies which are essential for enhancing water security, and innovative approaches such as integrated water resource management (IWRM), the adoption of new technologies for water conservation and purification, and suggestions for the implementation of robust policies and governance frameworks.

Dr Rajeev Kumar, Chairperson at the Department of Environment Studies, Panjab University, Chandigarh, is among the 2% scientists in the World ranking in the field of Environment Science (2022-23). He obtained his Ph.D degree in Chemistry from the Department of Chemistry, Panjab University, Chandigarh. His research work focused on the eco-friendly removal of environmental pollutants, specifically on the fungal remediation of recalcitrant compounds. Dr. Kumar is the recipient of research awards from the different funding agencies of the Government of India *viz*. Science and Engineering Research Board (SERB)- a statutory body of the Department of Science & Technology (DST) and University Grants Commission (UGC) for his research endeavors. He has also been the Project Director of the Indo-US Partnership on Green Chemistry/Engineering and Technologies Education, Research, and Outreach for Sustainable Development funded by UGC and the Ministry for Human Resource and Development (MHRD), India. He has published 72 International research papers in with more than 180 citations in the journal of international repute making his H-index of 24. Dr. Rajeev Kumar has visited several countries for his research work and has International collaborators from various countries including USA, Israel, Singapore, Vietnam, and Australia.

Dr. Kumar discussed sustainable development through the Green Synthesis of Nanomaterials to reduce the toxicity caused by chemical methods. There are extensive anthropogenic activities in the environment which has dragged the attention of researchers towards the mitigation measures in which a significant section is occupied by the nanomaterials. His research team has compared the Fe<sub>3</sub>O<sub>4</sub> Nps synthesised by using scraps of naturally corroded iron i.e. iron rust against Fe<sub>3</sub>O<sub>4</sub> NPs synthesised by chemical precipitation method. The toxicity evaluation of well characterized Nps clearly demarcates the non-toxic nature of naturally derived Nps on bacterial population of *S. typhi, P. aeruginosa* and *E. coli* and fungal strain of *Laurilia taxodi*. The findings of this piece







of work reveal that contrary to the chemical method, the naturally obtained NPs are environment-friendly, economically viable, and non-toxic.

Prof.(Dr.) Thakur Gurjeet Singh, Dean - CCP facilitated the guest speakers and encouraged the students & researchers to interact with the distinguished speakers on various aspects of water security for sustainable development in Pharmaceutical industries. In the end, Prof,(Dr.) Ashutosh Mishra, Dean, of Journalism & Mass Communication conducted a panel discussion with all the experts along with conveners - Prof.(Dr) Jyotsna Kaushal & Dr. Gagandeep Singh on WATER SECURITY which was later broadcast on Chitkara FM 107.8 to the surrounding community.







laws and regulations, Definitions of Competency to Stand Trial and Criminal Responsibility for event. His Additional focus was on trauma-sensitive approaches, understanding the relationship between mental health disorders and impeachable offenses and ethical considerations in forensic practice. Simulations were also conducted on a case with Psychotic illness, depression and personality disorder. On the final day of Global Week, an assessment test was conducted for evaluation purposes.

These incredible sessions provided participants with comprehensive understanding of:-

- legal standards governing mental health competency
- enabling them to navigate related issues confidently


Event Summary: Posh Awareness Training. The What, Why, and How








# **About**

The session with Pradipta Ray offered students a rare glimpse into the intersection of design, fine art, and filmmaking, guided by her two decades of diverse creative experience. The event aimed to highlight the importance of pre-production in visual storytelling, with Pradipta showcasing her storyboards, pre-visualizations, and their transformation into final outputs. Her journey from commercial projects to deeply personal artworks inspired students to explore both industry and independent expressions. A highlight of the session was her storyboard work for *Rang De Basanti*, demonstrating how strong visual planning shapes impactful cinema.

#### **Description**

The session conducted by Pradipta Ray was an enriching and inspiring experience for students, offering a deep dive into the multifaceted world of visual storytelling through the lens of an artist, designer, and filmmaker. With over two decades of experience across commercial, fine art, and cinematic projects, Pradipta brought a rare blend of industry knowledge and personal creative exploration to the classroom.

The session began with an introduction to her diverse body of work, which seamlessly moves across different formats—ranging from commercial design assignments to highly expressive and introspective artworks. Her ability to navigate between client-based briefs and personal narratives offered students a valuable perspective on maintaining a balance between professional demands and individual voice in the creative industry.

A major focus of the event was on the pre-production process—an area often overlooked by students in their rush to complete finished products. Pradipta emphasized the importance of ideation, research, and visual planning in developing impactful narratives. She showcased her detailed storyboards and pre-visualizations, explaining how each frame acts as a blueprint for the final film. What made her presentation particularly impactful was the way she connected the preparatory materials to the completed visuals. This side-by-side comparison helped students clearly understand how an idea evolves from sketches and thumbnails to a fully realized cinematic experience.

Her candid walkthrough of her personal creative process also demystified the labor and intention behind visual storytelling. Students were introduced to a range of visual strategies, including framing, pacing, emotional rhythm, and color psychology, all of which contribute significantly to narrative development but are often missed in technical training. Pradipta also spoke about the emotional and psychological investment involved in storytelling—highlighting that the most resonant work often comes from a place of honesty and vulnerability.







The second half of the session took a more introspective turn, as Pradipta shared a series of her paintings—works of personal expression that explore sensitive themes and inner worlds. This portion of the presentation encouraged students to reflect on their own creative motivations and to consider art as a powerful medium of self-exploration and social commentary.

The session concluded with an exciting segment that showcased her storyboard work for the critically acclaimed Bollywood film *Rang De Basanti*. Students were captivated by the detailed visual planning and the narrative decisions that shaped key moments in the film. This case study not only demonstrated her technical prowess but also underlined the importance of collaboration, clarity, and consistency in working on large-scale cinematic projects.



#### **DESCRIPTION**

Chitkara Law School successfully organized a comprehensive two-day Moot Court Training Workshop on April 3-4th, 2025, aimed at enhancing the advocacy and research skills of budding legal professionals. The workshop witnessed enthusiastic participation from law students across all semesters and was conducted under the expert guidance of Advocate Anant Vijay Maria, Advocate-on-Record, Supreme Court of India. The inaugural session commenced with a welcome address by Prof. (Dr.) Ajay Ranga, Dean of Chitkara Law School, Chitkara University, Punjab who highlighted the importance of moot court activities in bridging the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application. She emphasized that such training workshops are essential in grooming students to be court-ready and confident legal practitioners. Day 1: Introduction to Mooting and Legal Research The first day focused on the fundamentals of moot court practices. Advocate Anant Vijay Maria delivered an insightful session on the structure of moot court competitions, court etiquette, and the foundational skills needed for effective mooting. He shared his personal experiences from practicing in the Supreme Court, providing valuable real-world context and inspiring students to develop a deep interest in litigation and legal research. Following his session, a practical workshop on legal research and memorial drafting was conducted by Anant Vijay Sir. Students were guided through research methodologies using online legal databases, proper citation styles, and the key elements of memorial writing. Teams were then formed and assigned a moot proposition to begin drafting arguments and researching legal issues. Day 2: Oral Advocacy and Mock Rounds The second day centered on oral advocacy and courtroom presentation. Advocate Anant Vijay Maria once again led the session, focusing on effective oral argumentation, case analysis, and managing judicial interventions. He coached students on courtroom decorum, articulation, and strategic thinking, enabling them to present arguments with confidence and clarity. In the latter half of the day, students participated in mock courtroom rounds judged by faculty members and legal professionals. Each team presented their case based on the memorials prepared the previous day. The feedback provided after each round helped students identify their strengths and areas for







improvement. Faculty coordinator Dr. Ankita Sangwan expressed heartfelt gratitude to Advocate Anant Vijay Maria for his invaluable mentorship and to all participants for their active involvement. This Moot Court Training Workshop proved to be a transformative learning experience, equipping students with essential advocacy skills and boosting their readiness for real-life legal practice.

The student interactive session was opened by the speaker by explaining the importance of reading good books and doing research for becoming a good lawyer. To explain his point, the speaker referred to Keshvanand Bharti case and origin of the concept of "Basic Structure". Further, he asked the students to refer to legal dictionary from time to time in order to be certain of the technical meaning of words as required by the lawyers; read good books to build up strong foundation of society and legal principles. He explained that a good lawyer also needs to good understanding of history, political science and sociology as law functions within the society. He further explained that a lawyer also needs to have good understanding of technology as there has been rapid use of technology in every aspect of life e.g. e-contracts; use of forensic science; use of AI etc. He further highlighted the need to read both foreign and Indian judgments. He quoted several cases where the courts have referred to foreign cases to decide the case. The speaker also stressed on the need to have good communication skills. For this, he suggested students to have clarity in thought and good command on language. The speaker highlighted the difference between trial court proceedings and higher court proceedings. He talked about the importance of trial court judgments and need for new lawyers to start practice and have some experience of trial court. Thereafter he took few questions from the students and in process, discussed about the corporate law practice; in house lawyer; different lucrative avenues of career for law students.

## **OBJECTIVE**

- 1. To gain a comprehensive understanding of ADR principles, including various methods like mediation, arbitration, negotiation, and others.
- 2. To make the students aware of ADR as a career opportunity.
- 3. To explain the legal aspects of ADR, including relevant laws and regulations to the students.
- 4. To learn practical skills necessary for participating in ADR processes, such as negotiation, active listening, and conflict resolution techniques through simulation







exercises.

5. To make the students learn about the strengths and weaknesses of different ADR techniques and how to choose the most appropriate method for a specific dispute.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

The workshop was based on subject Alternate Dispute Resolution mechanism to provide the students with overview of ADR, its importance, scope and kinds. Firstly, the speaker started with the history and importance of the ADR highlighting the 76th Indian Law Commission Report which about the delay in justice delivery system in our society and existing mechanism of settlement of disputes in our society before the Britishers came to India and introduced the adversarial system of justice delivery. He also discussed about the ADR being a career option for the lawyers. He further, briefly, talked about the British Indian law on ADR. He then went on to discuss the benefits of ADR through the famous Tungnath Chaturvedi case. In next session on Day 1, he started with discussing the various forums of ADR including Arbitration, Mediation and Negotiation and then Sec 89 of Civil Procedure Code highlighting the purpose of de-clogging the Indian Judiciary. He discussed about the principal laws on ADR including Legal Services Authority Act 1987, Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1986, Commercial Courts Act. 2015 and recent Mediation Act 2023. Thereafter the speaker delved deep in Arbitration Law by discussing the international and Indian law on Arbitration. He also discussed about the cases which is fit for arbitration through various case laws including Afcon Infrastructure Ltd. Vs Cherian Verkey Construction Company etc. He also talked about non-negotiable factors of arbitration including confidentiality, neutrality and binding nature of Arbitration. He also discussed about the limited grounds on which courts can intervene in arbitration procedure and grounds of appeal. He also discussed about the stages of arbitration, seats of arbitration, arbitral award form and contents. On Day 2, the speaker started with discussing Mediation explaining how it is a facilitated negotiation. He then discussed about the advantages and elements of Mediation. Thereafter he discussed about the SCARF Model to conflict resolution and highlighting how Mediation has all the characteristics. Thereafter, the speaker discussed the nuances of Mediation Act. 2023. In session two the Day 2, the speaker gave simulation exercises to the participants and in the end conducted an objective test for the participants. In the end, an MoU was signed between Samvad Mediation Centre and Chitkara Law School to foster mutual cooperation to organize future programs, exchange of experts, conduct certification programs, and facilitate student internships.

The lecture was opened by the speaker by explaining the difference between the two routes of dispute resolution i.e. through courts and through mediation. She also emphasized on the fact that a mediator cannot give legal advice. Mediator's role is creating a settlement agreement between the parties related to the dispute. In case if the client requires legal advice legal advice, the mediator needs to direct the client to a lawyer otherwise prepare the draft settlement agreement between the parties and send it to the court for finalization. Thereafter, the speaker talked about the Irish Professional Mediators Organisation (IMPO) where the professional mediators get themselves empaneled to carryout mediation work. This dynamic organization was established in 2021 and consists of all stakeholders including academics, practitioners and industry experts. She informed the audience about the kind of work IMPO does in Ireland to promote mediation. She also made a comparative analysis of Irish and Indian law on mediation. She also spoke about the key challenges faced by a new mediator ranging from getting mediation work, deciding which mediation model to use etc. She also informed that mediators need to have sufficient legal knowledge to understand the fact that court involvement might be necessary at any later stage of mediation. Through the driving test analogy, the speaker also highlighted that learning mediation and implementing it in the real world can be quite different experience.

- The students learnt about the various career opportunities in the field of mediation.



The referred guest not only made the students enlightened about the changes introduced in New Criminal Laws with reference to Crime against Women, but also emphasized to uplift and balance the societal mindset towards women in general. The session begins with the Welcome address of Prof. (Dr.) Ajay Ranga, Dean and Professor, Chitkara Law School followed by the address of the guest speaker. The expert speaker carried forward the session with detailed discussions on the newly defined offences and the changes in penalties for existing offences related to crimes against women, such as rape, sexual harassment, assault, and trafficking. The precedence given to crimes against women and children by placing them under a single chapter in the BNS was likely highlighted. The speaker also focussed on the procedural changes aimed at ensuring quicker investigation and trials in cases of sexual offences. Discussion was also made on how the new law on evidence impacts the prosecution of crimes against women, including the admissibility of electronic records as evidence and provisions for recording victim statements. Emphasis on newly introduced offences such as sexual intercourse on false promise of marriage, employment, or concealment of identity, and their potential impact on protecting women was made in the session. Focus was made on the provisions designed to support victims, such as the recording of statements through audio-visual means, the mandatory medical examination within seven days, and the provision of free medical aid including strict punishments in case of sexual offence. The Session moved further with Q/A in order to make it as more interactive. The faculty members and students posed different questions related to the theme of the session. The session ended by proposing a vote of thanks to the esteemed guest by Dr. Jasdeep Kaur, Associate Professor and Centre Faculty Coordinator, Chitkara Law School. Overall, it was an enriching session for all the participants.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

Sh. Shaleen Mitra, OSD to the Hon'ble Health Minister, and his team visited Chitkara School of Psychology and Counselling on May 7, 2025, to engage academia and youth in the "War against Drugs" (Yudh Nashiyan Virudh) programme. Mr. Mitra presented alarming data on drug usage in Punjab, highlighting the significant shortage of mental health professionals in both government and private sectors, despite 7.2 lakh individuals receiving care at OOAT centers. He stressed the urgency of bolstering community psychology outreach and proposed launching a drug de-addiction capsule programme in Punjab universities. The pervasive threat of Narco Terrorism was also underscored. Discussions with faculty focused on forging linkages, initiating a leadership course in mental health, and establishing district-level technical resource centers to reach affected communities. The visit aimed to foster academic involvement in addressing this critical public health issue.

#### **OUTCOMES**

- 1. Increased awareness among students and faculty regarding the prevalence and impact of drug abuse in Punjab.
- 2. Identification of potential avenues for academic contribution to the "War against Drugs" programme.
- 3. Development of preliminary plans for community psychology initiatives targeting drug addiction.
- 4. Exploration of a framework for a drug de-addiction capsule programme suitable for university settings.
- 5. Initiation of discussions and planning for a leadership course in mental health and the establishment of district-level technical resource centers.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

The Teaching Learning Centre (TLC) of the Department of Electronics Communication Engineering, Chitkara University Institute of Engineering Technology (CUIET), organized a highly engaging and thought-provoking session titled "Revolutionizing Assessment: From Grades to Growth" on 7th May 2025. With her expertise in educational innovation and faculty training, Prof. Kaur provided deep insights into the evolving role of assessment in higher education. She highlighted the importance of designing evaluation frameworks that go beyond numerical grades and emphasize feedback, engagement, and continuous improvement. A significant highlight of the session was the demonstration of interactive digital tools such as Kahoot, Mentimeter, and FigJam. These platforms are widely recognized for their ability to promote active learning and real-time feedback. Prof. Kaur showcased their classroom applications through live demonstrations, illustrating how such tools can be seamlessly integrated into teaching to improve student participation and learning outcomes. Faculty members enthusiastically took part in the hands-on activities, exploring how these technologies could be used to make assessments more dynamic, inclusive, and reflective of individual student progress. The session emphasized that assessments should not merely serve to judge student performance but also to inform teaching strategies and motivate learners. The discussion also centered around promoting a growth mindset, where mistakes are viewed as learning opportunities, and the focus remains on continuous improvement. Prof. Kaur encouraged educators to adopt practices that nurture critical thinking, creativity, and self-reflection among students. The session concluded with faculty members gaining practical strategies and tools to reframe their assessment methods. Aligned with the broader







mission of the TLC, this initiative reinforced Chitkara University's commitment to educational excellence through innovation, collaboration, and reflective teaching practices.

#### **OUTCOMES**

- Faculty members gained hands-on experience with interactive tools to make assessments more engaging and effective.



professionals, such as workload, ethical dilemmas, and work-life balance.

• Developing Legal Skills: Enhance students' critical thinking, analytical reasoning, and communication skills through observation and interaction.

## **DESCRIPTION**

The legal profession offers a diverse range of career paths, each with unique responsibilities and opportunities like Litigation, Corporate Law, Judiciary, Legal Academia, Public Sector, Alternative Legal Careers and like. The students were made aware that pursuing a career in law typically involves the different educational pathways like Undergraduate Law Programs (5-year integrated program) in which admission is commonly through entrance exams like the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) or individual university tests, Postgraduate Law Programs in which admission may be based on entrance exams or merit. After completing an law program, aspiring lawyers must pass the All India Bar Examination (AIBE) to practice law in India. The emphasis was also laid into the academic requirements and the practical aspects of legal education, aiding in their preparation for these admission procedures. The students were made aware that while the legal profession offers rewarding opportunities, it also presents certain challenges like high competition, work-life balance, emotional stress and continuous learning as the evolving nature of law necessitates continuous education and adaptation to new legal developments. Many students report a heightened interest in pursuing a legal career following the programme. Students were more confident in their ability to engage with legal concepts and professionals. The student participants gain a clearer understanding of the qualifications and personal attributes needed for success in the legal field.

# **OUTCOMES**

- Career Awareness: Demonstrate a clear understanding of different legal professions and the pathways to enter them.
- Admission Knowledge: Articulate the admission procedures for law programs and the qualifications required.
- Professional Insights: Identify the challenges faced by legal professionals and the skills needed to overcome them.

- 5. To promote awareness of fundamental duties as a part of responsible citizenship and encourage debate on their relevance.
- 6. To highlight the importance of Intellectual Property rights in the digital age and conduct related activities to solidify understanding.

### **DESCRIPTION**

Chitkara Law School – Immersion Programme Report (27 May to 4 June, 2025) Chitkara Law School organized an engaging and enriching Immersion Programme for school students from May 27 to June 4, 2025, aiming to introduce them to the fundamentals of law, justice, and careers in the legal profession. The inaugural address on May 26 by Dr. Jasdeep Kaur, Associate Professor and Programme Coordinator, welcomed students into the world of law, highlighting its importance in ensuring fairness, protecting rights, and shaping responsible citizens. Day 1, The first session by Dr. Jasdeep Kaur on "Landscape of Opportunities and Challenges in the Legal Profession" introduced students to diverse career paths beyond traditional courtroom practice, touching upon legal tech, policymaking, compliance, and corporate law. Prof. (Dr.) Shobha Gulati guided students through the path of becoming a judicial officer, exam patterns, preparation strategies, and the responsibilities of judicial service, motivating students through personal insights and realworld advice. Day 2, students visited the District Court Patiala under the guidance of Mr. Arun Vatsyayan. They observed live court proceedings, interacted with practicing advocates, and gained firsthand exposure to court functioning, including case hearings and bar association procedures. Day 3 featured sessions on internship and placement opportunities by Mr. V.N. Mohan, addressed on importance of studying in legal education and profession, which improves critical thinking, communication, and problem-solving skills. Prof. (Dr.) Shobha Gulati addressed the students about the importance of mooting in building advocacy skills, legal research, and courtroom confidence. Day 4, Dr. Akshiptika Rattan introduced students to to the fundamental concepts of sociology and its significance in understanding individual behavior within the broader social structure,







sociological perspectives on law, followed by Dr. Kanika Gaur's activity-based session on crime scene management. Students analyzed case photos, deliberated on causes of death, and explored the role of socially sensitive policing and forensic accuracy in legal processes. Day 5 covered the civil suit process and the interplay of law and morality through sessions by Mr. Arun Vatsyayan educated on an overview of the civil justice system, where students were introduced to the various stages involved in a civil suit—from the filing of a plaint to the final decree. Dr. Shashi Bhushan Ojha addressed the session, evidentiary value, and distinctions between legal obligations and moral duties, explained the meaning and difference between things being legal-illegal and things being wrong-right. Day 6, Dr. Avnish Kumar Singh led an insightful session on Fundamental Duties, followed by a student-led debate on their necessity in modern India, encouraging civic awareness and critical engagement. Day 7, The final day included sessions by Dr. Polaki on Intellectual Property Rights. Students learned about copyright, patents, and trademarks, and analyzed real-world IP conflicts through discussions and case studies. The closing address on June 6 celebrated students' enthusiasm and growth, instilled critical thinking, legal awareness, and a spirit of responsible citizenship. It concluded with feedback form the programme coordinator Dr. Jasdeep Kaur along with student representative concluding with certificate distribution.

#### **Overview**
