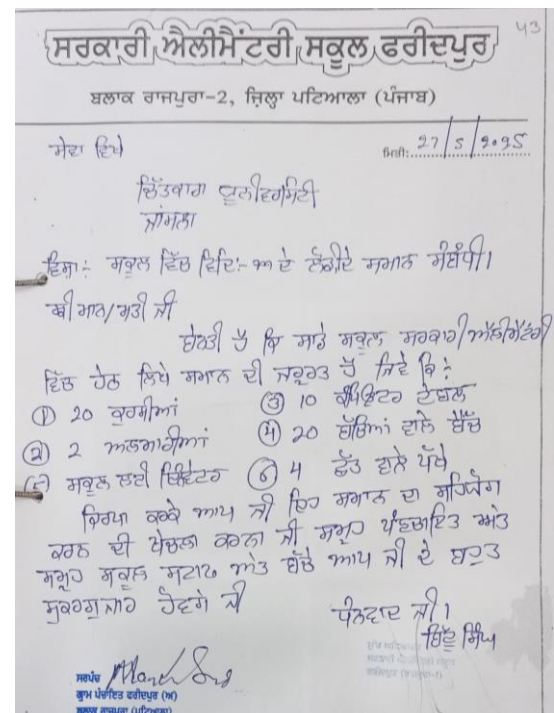

The **computer chairs** will enhance the school's computer lab, allowing students to work more comfortably during their IT sessions. The **almirahs** will help securely store documents, records, and other educational resources in a systematic manner.

On 15th July 2025, World Youth Skills Day was marked at Chitkara University, Punjab with a gesture that carried both artistry and purpose. DESCRIPTION

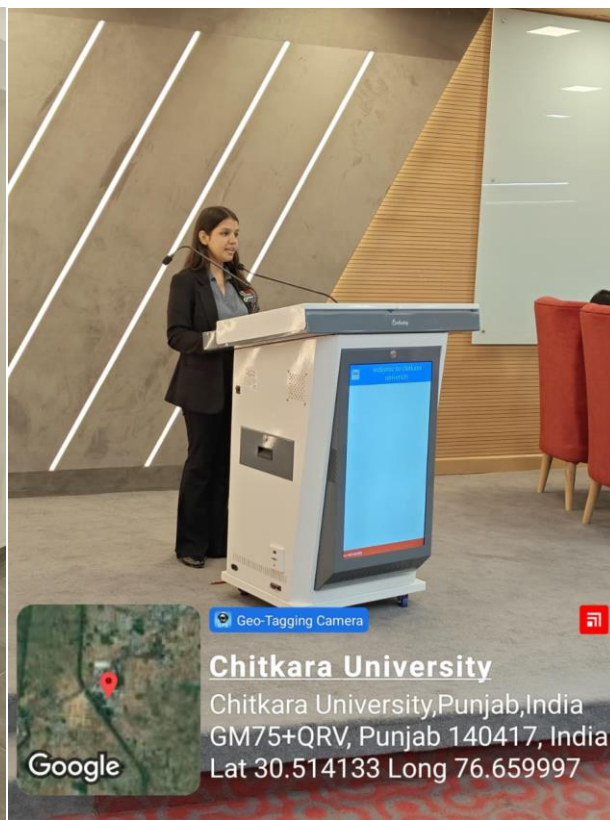
MUN TRADESTORM 2025 was an academic activity organized by Chitkara Business School that gave students a platform to act like representatives of different countries. The focus of this Model United Nations was not on debating or competition, but on presenting ideas, sharing perspectives, and offering solutions in a calm and respectful discussion format. The event took place on 29th July 2025 and was divided into four interesting and rich learning rounds. In the first round, delegates delivered a one-minute speech to introduce their country's economic



situation. The second round allowed each delegate to speak in more detail for three minutes, explaining how their country views global trade, currency issues, or economic conflicts. The third round focused on forming alliances among like-minded countries and discussing solutions to common economic problems. Delegates interacted with each other, shared their views, and worked together to present ideas that could help achieve economic balance. The fourth and final round was a Q&A session, where student reporters questioned the delegates to understand their positions better and challenge their suggestions. This activity was a great way to help students practice public speaking, team collaboration, critical thinking, and develop a better understanding of international economic challenges. It was an educational and engaging session that prepared students for real-life situations where communication and cooperation are key.

OUTCOMES

1. Students learned how to analyze and explain economic issues faced by different countries.
2. They gained experience in delivering both short and detailed speeches.
3. Participants learned how to form groups and work together toward common goals.
4. They developed the confidence to answer questions in front of an audience.
5. The event improved their problem-solving and communication skills in a real-world setting.

Objectives

2. Create dialogue around women's bodies, care, and agency without hesitation or social discomfort.

On 26th August 2025, Women's Equality Day unfolded at Mohi Kalan, Chitkara University's newly adopted village, with an initiative guided by the National Service Scheme. It arrived with purpose, carried by people who understood that equality is built through presence, patience, and work done on ordinary ground.

The day placed two ideas firmly into the soil: awareness and growth. A session on women's health and hygiene was delivered by Dr. Gurpreet Kaur from the Department of Nursing, Chitkara University, Punjab. Her words were direct and grounded. She spoke of the body without hesitation, of care without shame, of knowledge as something owed, not borrowed. The women listened with attention shaped by lived experience. Questions followed. Answers stayed with them.

Later, the group moved outside. Saplings were placed into the earth at the site where a sewing centre will soon stand. The act carried weight. Hands pressed soil around roots that would hold fast through heat and rain. In time, the centre will offer skill, income, and steadiness. That afternoon, trees and threads began together. The land accepted both.

What gave the day its deepest meaning was the presence of an all-women panchayat, led by a woman Sarpanch. Leadership was not discussed as theory. It stood visible, practiced, and real. Decisions were made by women who knew their village and were trusted to shape its future. Their authority did not announce itself. It showed through calm direction and shared responsibility.

As the day drew on, a sense of completion settled gently across the village. What had been shared did not end there; it carried itself forward. Knowledge had found attentive minds, saplings stood newly rooted, and the promise of skill and livelihood had taken a visible form. The presence of women in leadership affirmed what the day had already shown that strength, when recognized and supported, multiplies. Mohi Kalan did not change in a single afternoon, but it moved ahead with assurance, guided by women who understood how to nurture both land and lives.

Outcomes

1. Women engaged openly with health knowledge, asking questions shaped by lived experience.
2. Saplings marked the beginning of a skill-based livelihood space grounded in community trust.
3. Women-led governance stood present, reinforcing confidence in collective decision-making and village direction.

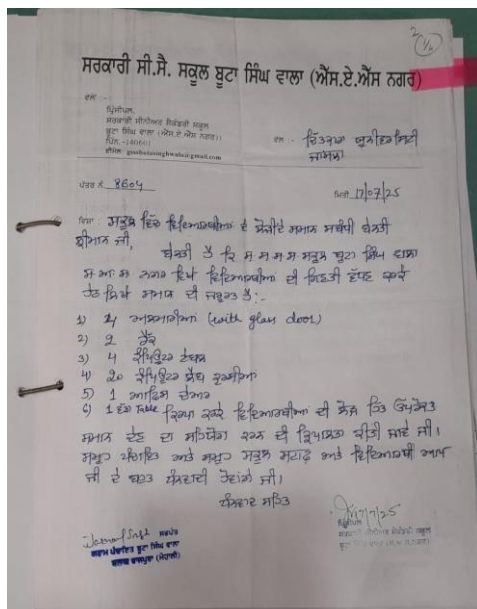


Empowering Classrooms, Enriching Lives

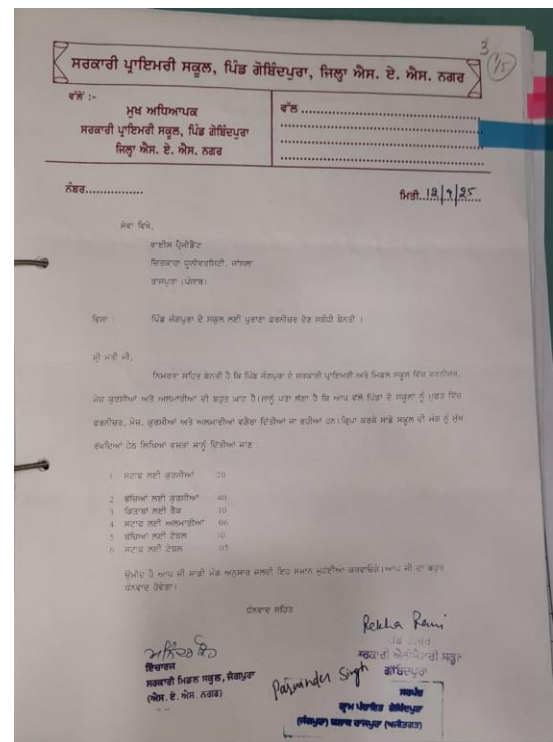
Overview

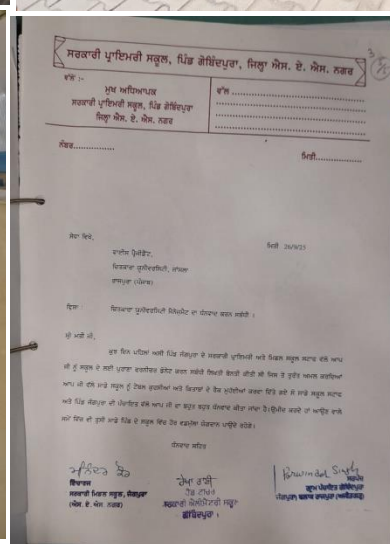
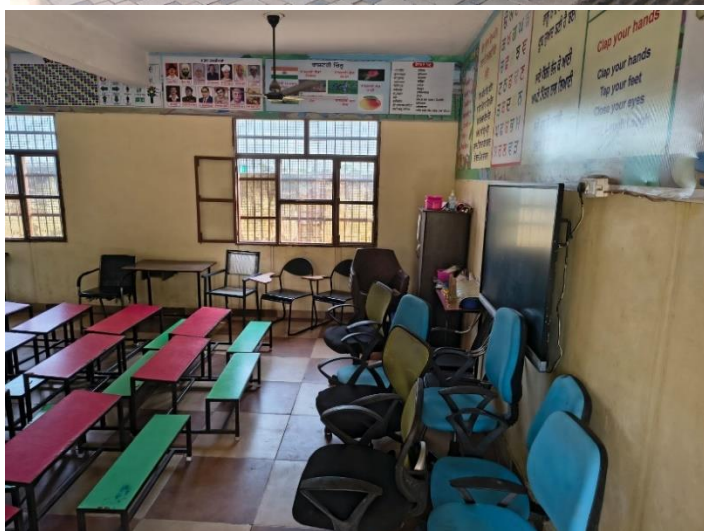
atmosphere for the students. Before-and-after arrangements reflected a visible improvement, transforming under-furnished areas into well-equipped and student-friendly learning spaces.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

Impact

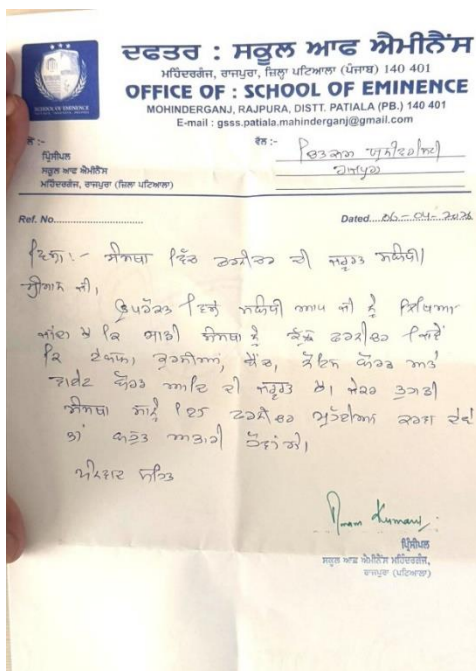

The furniture were arranged to improve classroom seating capacity and comfort for students, contributing towards a more organized and functional learning environment.



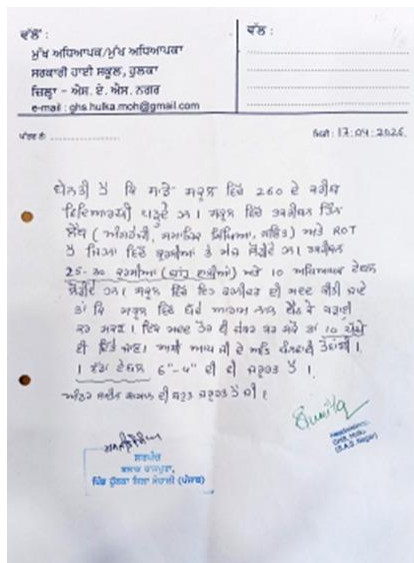
Impact
