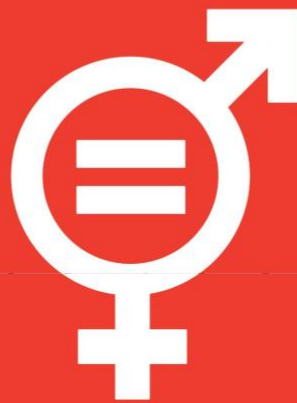

These events showcase Chitkara University's commitment to promoting gender equality (SDG 5) across various domains, including education, workplace, sports, entrepreneurship, and legal support.


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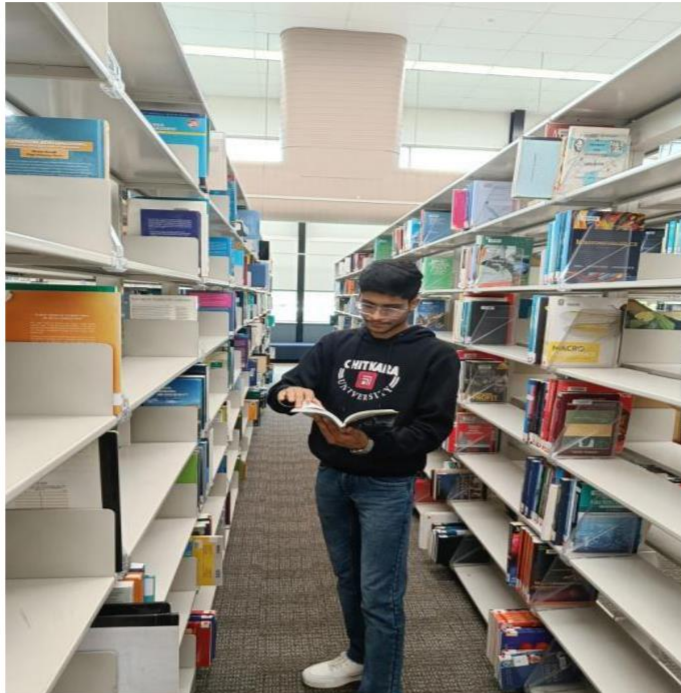

opportunities for women and girls to develop new skills build confidence and expand their networks. Ultimately exchange programs play a crucial role in promoting gender equality.



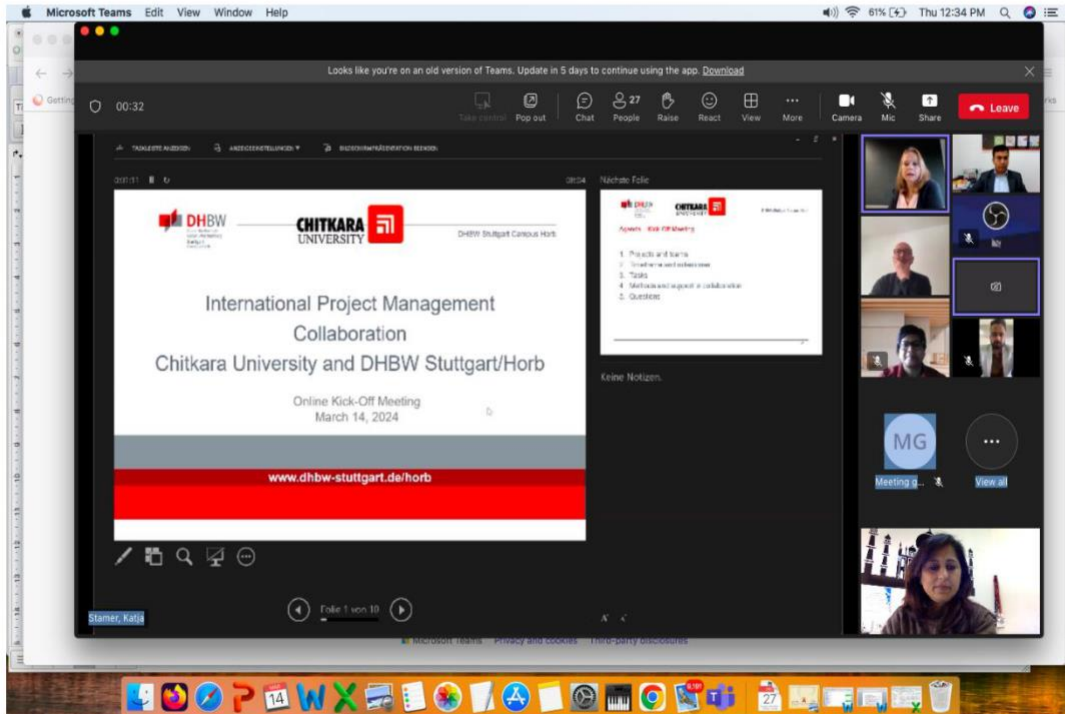

## **About the activity**

A total of sixty students from different departments opted for various programs spearheaded by the Office of International Affairs. The Short Mobility summer school programs are always meant to be a transformative and memorable experience with a lasting impression. Students returned home with new friendships, unforgettable memories, and a renewed sense of curiosity and openness to the world. This academic year, the International Summer School by the University of Nottingham, Malaysia campus, stretching from July 3<sup>rd</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> was a two-week summer school focusing primarily on the student's openness to discovering new things, adjusting to other surroundings, and getting involved with international issues. This allowed the students to make their resumes look stronger and become more competitive when looking for a job or applying for graduate school. A total of 20 students from different departments and disciplines participated in this summer school, The University of British Columbia organized a month-long international summer program from July 14<sup>th</sup> to July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Five students from different programs at our university participated in the given UBC-VSP where the major highlights were living on the UBC Vancouver campus in the modern student residences, with an opportunity to study two uniquely designed courses taught by world-class UBC instructors. Two students from the Computer Science and Engineering, and Computer Applications department availed this summer school opportunity called the ICT Summer School 2023. The majority of courses in this program were engineering-related, but some included trans disciplinary subjects like business and communication to accommodate students from a variety of academic backgrounds. The course emphasized on experiential learning through case studies, group projects, and practical exercises. Five students from the Computer Science and Engineering Department also went for a short-term mobility program at Deakin University, Australia. A total of eleven students from different departments opted for the Credit Transfer Articulation Program Four students articulated their degrees at Deakin University, Australia, one student to York University, Canada, three at the University of Manitoba, one at South Dakota State University, USA and two in University of Prince Edward Island, Canada. 12 students from different departments took the Internship program in Taiwan, Italy, Germany, and New Zealand in a virtual mode. The Taiwan Experience Education Program (TEEP) is an initiative by the Taiwanese government aimed at promoting international exchanges and cooperation in education. Six students from the Computer Science and Engineering department were selected for this esteemed internship opportunity. TEEP provided scholarships and funding to support the participants during their educational experience in Taiwan. These financial incentives can help the students to cover tuition fees,

living expenses, travel costs, and other related expenses. Three students from the Computer Science and Engineering department went for a Semester Exchange program at Fontys University of Applied Sciences, Netherlands and two students from the School of Architecture and Planning opted for a semester exchange program at La Salle Ramon Llull University, Spain, and University of Alicante, Spain respectively.

By opting for such opportunities, our students had the opportunity to study globally relevant courses from world-class faculty through such programs, students were exposed to peers and instructors from different parts of the world which also gave them insights into diverse viewpoints and perspectives on global issues. This helped them broaden their understanding of complex issues and encouraged critical thinking and intercultural dialogue. Exchange programs allow individuals to learn about different cultures and perspectives. By participating in these programs people can gain a better understanding of gender issues and work towards creating a more inclusive and equal society. 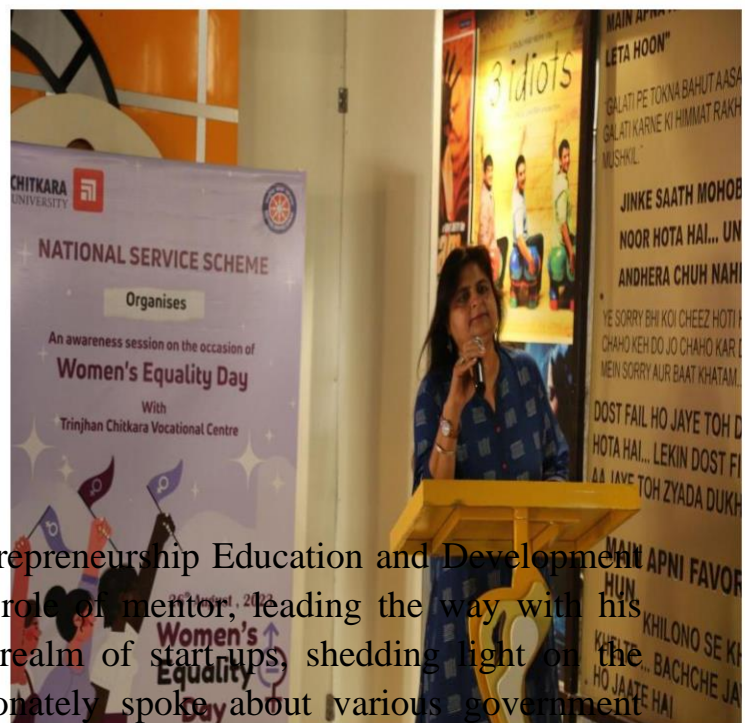
## Description of Event

Legal Aid Clinic is part and parcel of every educational institution engaged in providing legal education. 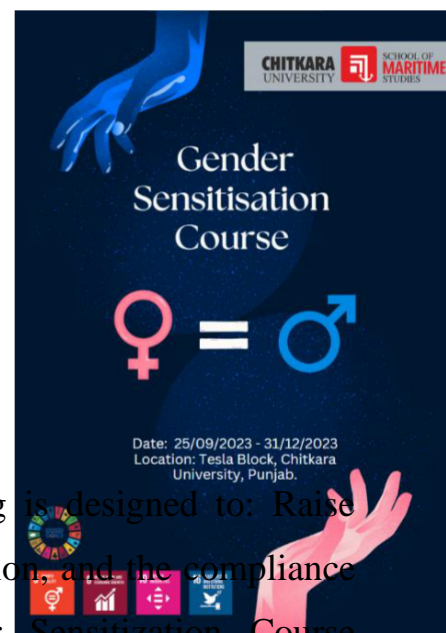

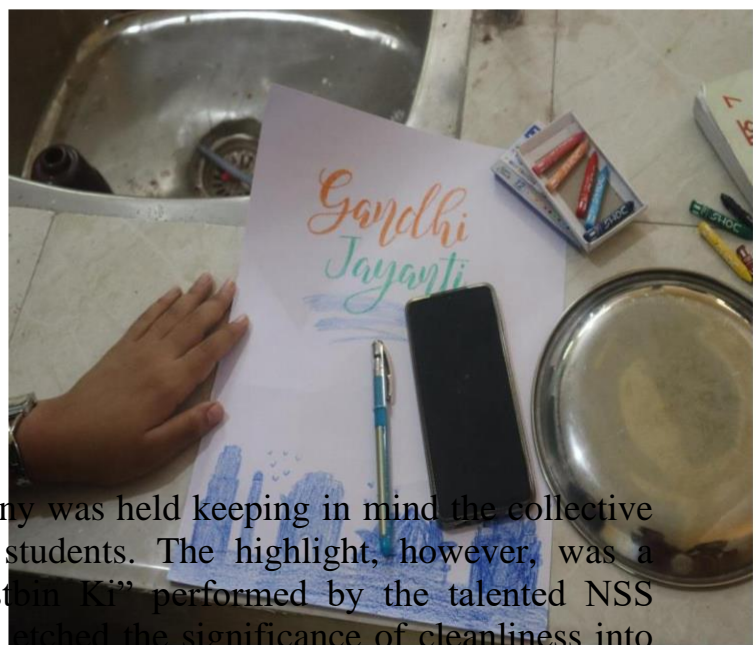
## Description of Event

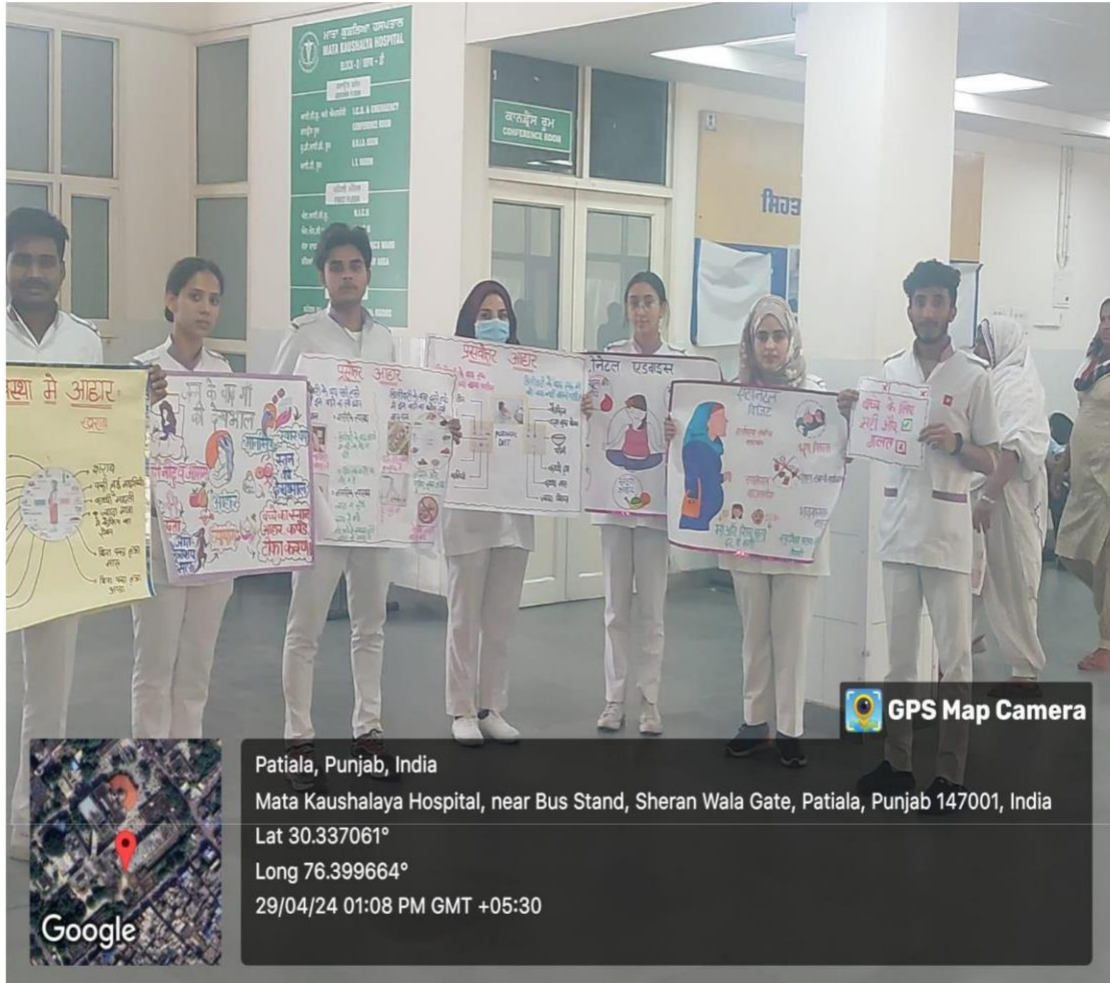
### **Objectives:**

### **Description:**

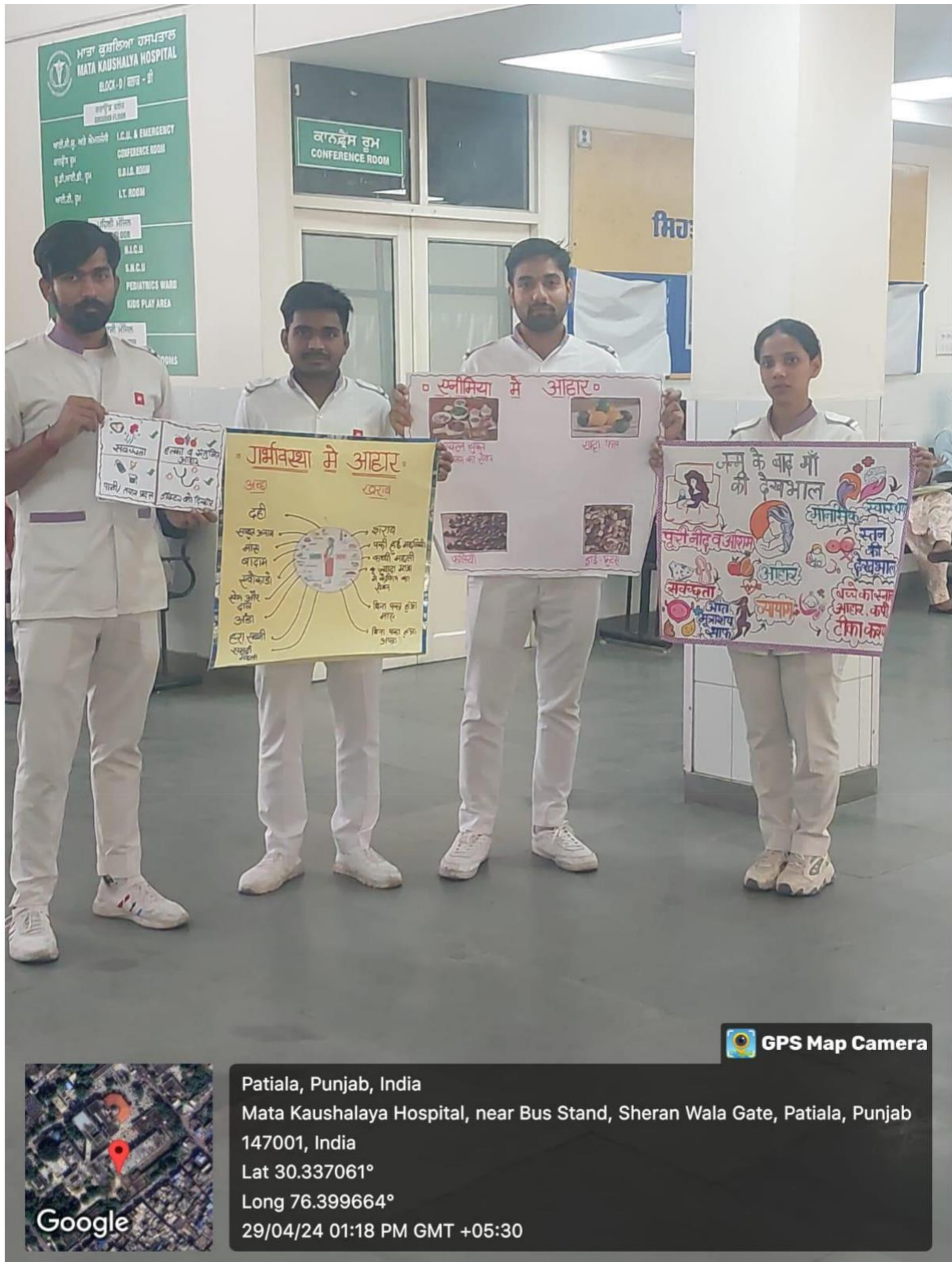

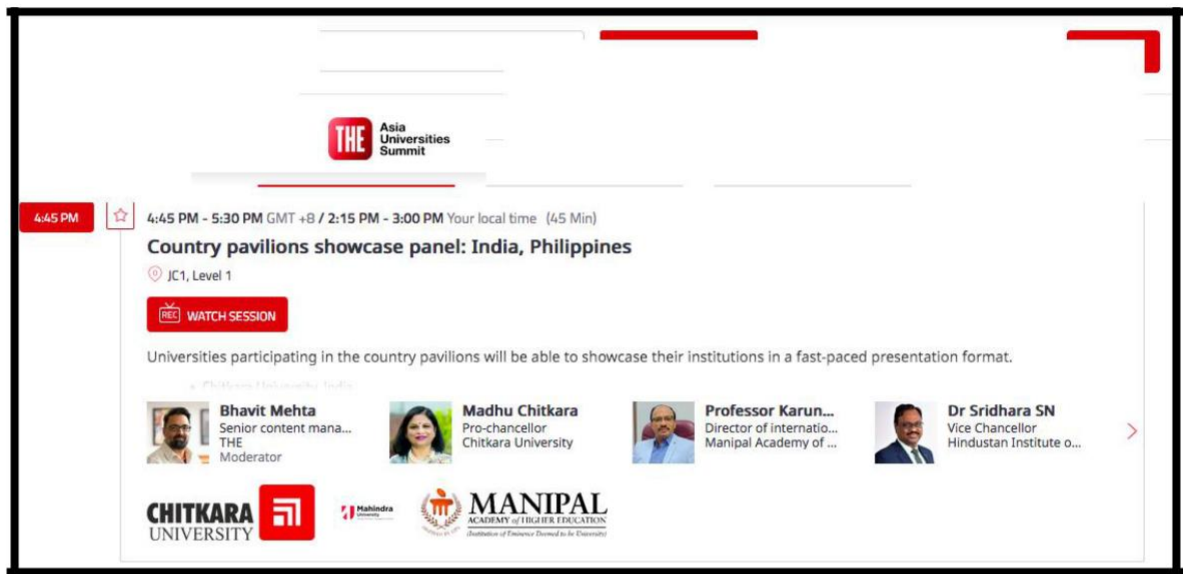

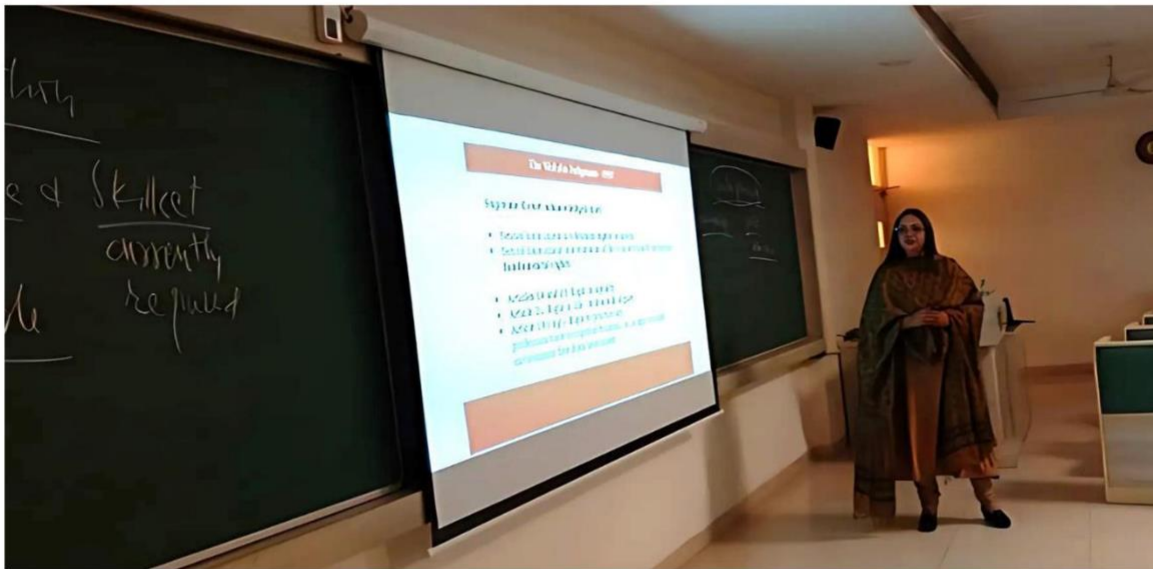

### **About the Activity:** -

The India Immersion Program "Doing Business in India" offered a comprehensive and intensive learning experience for students from Mondragon University, Spain, during their week-long visit. Designed to equip them with the knowledge and understanding to navigate the intricacies of the Indian business landscape, the program covered a diverse range of topics. The program provided an in-depth exploration of the Indian economy, including market entry strategies, foreign investment regulations, and the Goods and Services Tax

(GST) structure. Experts unpacked the unique aspects of Indian business culture, including negotiation styles and leadership approaches, drawing comparisons with European practices. Sessions explored high-growth sectors in India, such as healthcare and information technology (IT). Students gained valuable insights into startup ecosystems and business models for sustainable growth, with case studies showcasing successful Indian ventures. A visit to Mahindra Swaraj Tractors provided firsthand exposure to a leading Indian manufacturing company's operation.

Beyond academic sessions, the program incorporated cultural activities to broaden the students' understanding of India. Students participated in

creating Rangoli designs, tying turbans, and draping sarees. Visits to the Golden Temple in Amritsar and Shimla offered a glimpse into India's rich heritage and diverse landscapes. The program culminated in student presentations where they showcased their learnings by creating a business manual comparing shoe sole production in two Indian cities. This final project allowed them to synthesize the knowledge gained throughout the week and demonstrate their critical thinking skills. The program's success was further solidified by the positive feedback from students and the expressed interest in future collaborations between Mondragon University and Chitkara University.

### **Day wise report:**

**On Day 1, 6<sup>th</sup> May 2024**, representatives from Chitkara Business School including Dr. Sandhir Sharma, Dr. Sanjeev Sahni, and Dr. Rashmi Aggarwal welcomed delegates, Prof.



Xabier Romano and student ambassadors from Mondragon University, Spain. After introductions and a talk on Chitkara University's history and goals, faculty members Dr. Neeraj Anand and Dr. Subodh Saluja presented insights on "Doing Business in India." The event also included cultural activities like Rangoli making, turban tying, and saree draping, led by Dr. Sovia Singh, along with presentations and gift-giving.

**On Day 2, 7<sup>th</sup> May 2024**, Dr. Neeraj Anand kicked things off with a session on "Introduction to Business in Asia," exploring opportunities and challenges with a focus on the Indian market. A knowledge-testing quiz followed. The afternoon brought Dr. Subodh Saluja and Dr. Prachi Gupta, who delved into "Asian Leadership and Management Styles" and business innovation in India, respectively. Finally, Dr. Adarsh Agarwal discussed the "Indian Startup Ecosystem" with students participating in an activity to generate their innovative business ideas.

**Day 3, 8<sup>th</sup> May 2024**, began with Dr. Subodh Saluja exploring Indian business culture through communication styles and the Mumbai Dabbawalas case study. Dr. Shuchi Dawra followed up by examining the impact of culture on business using Hofstede's dimensions. The focus then shifted to globalization with Dr. Neeraj Anand's session on "Globalization of Asian Firms" featuring case studies of Indian and Asian companies. Dr. Rashmi Aggarwal concluded the day's lectures by highlighting the rise of fintech in Asia, particularly India, using a WeChat case study. Students participated in a quiz to test their understanding, and the afternoon featured fun outdoor activities showcasing the campus's sports facilities, including table tennis, badminton, and swimming.

**On Day 4, 9<sup>th</sup> May 2024**, Dr. Neeraj Anand kicked off with a session on navigating market entry and investment in India, including key considerations, entry strategies, and company registration using a Foxconn case study. Dr. Deepak Sood followed by explaining the

The afternoon focused on Asian business opportunities, with Dr. Subodh Saluja exploring tech innovation, retail trends, and growth drivers like Xiaomi and Alibaba. Dr. Keerti then highlighted medical sector opportunities in India, encompassing medical tourism, home healthcare, and telemedicine, along with the Ayushman Bharat scheme. The day concluded with Mr. Manav Bansal, Chief Happiness Officer, leading an engaging session on the "science of wellbeing."

**Day 5, 10<sup>th</sup> May 2024**, began with Dr. Neeraj Anand outlining legal considerations for foreign businesses in India, followed by a student potential exploration activity. Patent filing procedures were covered by Dr. Panda next. Dr. Neeraj Anand then shifted the focus to India's attractiveness as a business destination, citing examples of Spanish entrepreneurs in India. The day concluded with Dr. Dhiresk Kulshrestha's

presentation comparing the Indian and Spanish economies, including a discussion on economic diversification and structural transformation.

**Day 9, 14<sup>th</sup> May 2024**, focused on Indian business landscapes. Dr. Subodh Saluja opened the day with a session on attractive business clusters, highlighting locations like Bengaluru's IT hub and Hyderabad's pharmaceutical industry. Dr. Neeraj Anand followed by presenting successful startup strategies in India, including key growth sectors, business models, and case studies of Byju's, IKEA, TaxiBot, Delta Airlines, and others. Prashant Singh from CEED concluded the day by showcasing the Chitkara University startup ecosystem, featuring incubated startups like CustoShoe and Kala Coach.

**Day 10, 15<sup>th</sup> May 2024**, delved into startup business models. 

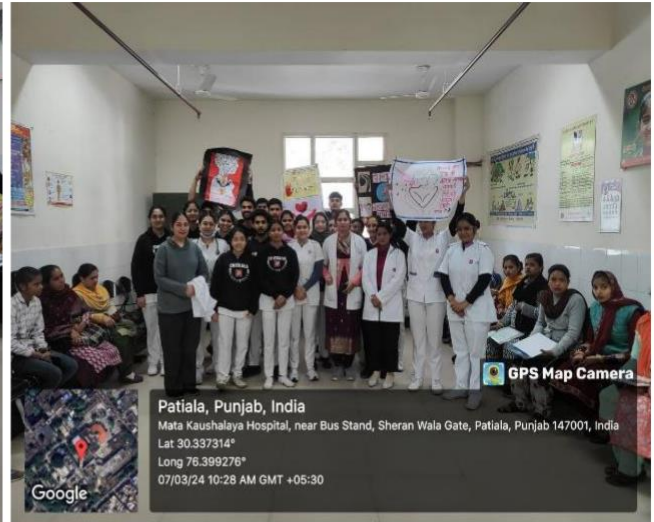
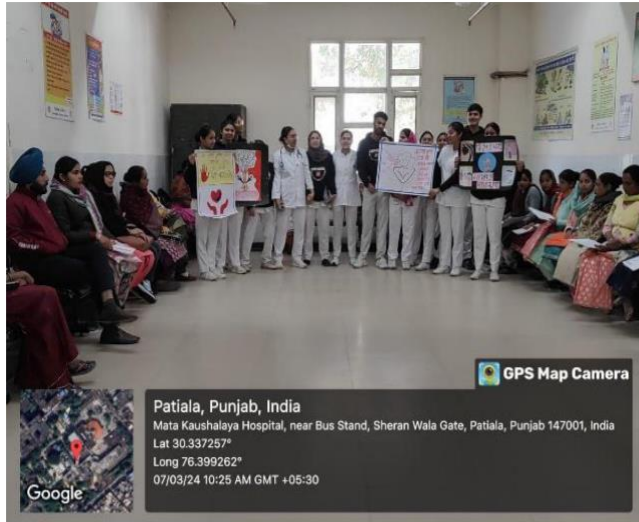
